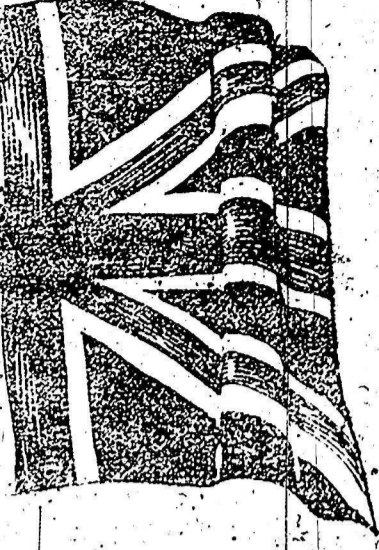

BUILD SHIPS WITHOUT RIVETS

BRITISH EMPLOY ELECTRIC
WELDING IN MANY YARDS

Investigation Shows That Strength is
Not Diminished by This
New Process.

The continued depletion of the British mercantile marine owing to the failure of new construction to keep pace with the losses arising from the enemy action and marine casualties has led to the adoption of various expedients to expedite the building of new tonnage. The standard ship program since extended by the decision to build fabricated ships, of which the first was launched during September, and the large program of concrete ship-building, are the main expedients which have hitherto been applied to increase the output from British yards. These expedients have resulted in a twofold economy, arising from the large use which can be made of unskilled and semi-skilled shipbuilding labor, as well as labor from sources which have not previously been devoted to shipbuilding, and a reduction in the quantity of steel required for a given tonnage.
