The bank of transformers, which forms part of this new extension, consists of three 900-Kva. units and one spare rated as follows: Primary 4:000 volts, secondary 22000 volts; 60-cycle single-phase, bil-insulated, water, cooled, the complete bank is con-

In order that good regulation may be assured on the transmission lines throughout the Eugenia System, an automatic generator voltage regulator has been installed for this purpose.

The new switching equipment, which forms part of the improvements included in the new extension, consists of equipment for three additional outgoing feeders, with provision for two spare switching equipments as soon as these are required. house are of the remote control type, and are operated from a control room! which is located in the northwest corner of the building.

The present capacity of the Eugenia power house in generating equipment is approximately 8,000 horsepower, and the extension to the building and installation of the switching equipment have been so constructed that an additional 4.000 horsepower unit, as well as an additional bank of transformers and switching equipment, can be installed without alteration to the building.

The placing of the new unit in operation will enable the Commission to be completely overhaul the two original units which have been operating constantly since power was first turned on, November, 1915.

The additional power develope by the new unit, together with that available from the two original units after they have been overlauled, will enable the Commission to take care of the growing loads in the Eugenia District, as well as supplying power to the various municipalities in Bruce County and the northern part of Huron County.

The new territory which will be served, and already referred to as the Bruce County District, covers delivery power to the municipalities of Walkerton, Formosa, Mildmayl Teeswater, Wingham, Fordwich, Gorrie. Wroxeter, Lucknow, Ripley, Kincardine, Southampton and Port Elgin: The possibilities of supplying power to other municipalities in this district together with those mentioned aboxe, are being investigated by the Commission's engineers at the present

This extension to the Eugenia System into Bruce and Huron Counties comprises the construction of 67 miles of 22000-volt transmission line, 51 miles of which will be 10 steel reinforced aluminum conductor, and guest of Mrs. J. Thirty-three and one half miles of 4,000-volt line will be required, the conductor for which will probably be No. 2 steel reinforced aluminum.
