Dundalk Got German Gun.—Through the influence of Col. McFarland, of the old 147th Grey Battalion, and of Mr. R. J. Ball, M. P. for South-East Grey, Dundalk received last week from the Director of War Trophies at Ottawa, a splendid souvenir of the Great War in the form of a captured German field gun. It should be stated that shortly after the armistice was signed a committee of citizens was appointed to make application for a suitable war trophy for the village, and correspondence with this end in view was begun. The trophy occupies a position on the boulevard at the town hall corner and it will probably have a prominent place in the Soldiers' Memorial Park at the formal opening of Dundalk's big day, June 24, when Premier Drury and other leading men will be here.—Dundalk Herald.

This was the first annual meeting of the weekly newspaper Publishers since they became a separate organization from the daily seven months ago. All parts of the Dominion were represented, many of the editors bringing their wives along, thus greatly adding to the pleasure of the gathering. In the earlier days of newspaperdom in Canada party feeling and political animosity ran high. The stirring questions of those days were the themes of violent editorials. Indeed personal friendships between newspapermen of opposite political views were rare, and it has been a prominent feature late years of the Press Association to mend this state of affairs and these efforts have certainly not been in vain.

Coupled with this laudable aim, the Association at its sessions persistently emphasizes the importance and benefits, not only of practically cultivating fraternal goodwill, but to constantly aim at raising the standard of morality, harmony and loyalty, in our various communities.

As weekly newspapermen, we have our own special problems, and the work of the Canadian Weekly Newspaper Association is to help solve these problems.
