The Origin of Meteors.

No question has been more disputed concerns the origin of "shooting stars" more properly called meteors.

Laplace was of opinion that they came from volcanoes on the moon. A recent authority, Sir Robert Ball, thought that perhaps they were thrown. out from terrestral volcanoes in the distant past.

What we are able to observe of them from specimens that fall upon the earth would seem to indicate that they are debris of some kind. The northwestern part of Uruguay is a newly discovered field for the production of amethysts, which occur in "geodes."
