Your Feelings - BY H. ADDINGTON BRUCE. There are numerous people, who would profit in numerous ways, by adopting the point of view of the philosopher who refused to allow anybody to hurt his feelings.

"If a person doesn't mean to be insulting," he explained, "and is simply thoughtless and tactless, it would be foolishly narrow-minded to put a wrong construction on his words and be aggrieved and resentful because of them."

"And if a person does mean to be insulting and does want to hurt one's feelings, why give him the satisfaction of realizing his desire?"

If this sage view were given general adoption, there would be far fewer men perpetually out of work because of a "sensitiveness" that impels them to quit their jobs, whenever anybody says anything to them that they do not altogether like.

Our prisons would have fewer occupants of the class herded in them for crimes of violence due to passion for revenge.

And parodies on poor, deluded, crime-maddened men would not add to the maintenance cost of our hospitals for the insane by anything but the extent that they do today.

It is for society in general it would be an immensely happier, more contented, more prosperous and efficient collection of individuals than it now is.

Every time a person does allow his feelings to be hurt he acts in a detrimental to his own good and the good of others.

He may not show that he is hurt, but the inner turmoil he experiences reverberates through his whole being.

Disturbing his poise, it disturbs his judgment, disturbs, indeed, the functioning of all his mental processes.

This means a distinct impairing of productive efficiency. And whatever impairs productive efficiency injures society as well as the individual.

To be sure, there are people so constituted that it is next to impossible for them to refuse to allow their feelings to be hurt. But they are a distinct minority.

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Canada's Maple Products

A GOOD HOLSTEIN COW

Gave 523 pounds of milk in Seven Months. Torby Township has always taken front rank in producing fine stock and all kinds of farm products, and it is not surprising that some choice dairy herds are being built up. A pure bred Holstein owned by Chalmers and West, at the farm of Mrs. Chalmers, Creamery Hill, has in seven days given five hundred and twenty-three pounds of milk, her milk on her best day weighing eighty-two and a half pounds. This cow is not yet at her best, being only five years old. She was bred and raised on the farm of Mr. Robert Dunn, pioneer Holstein breeder, of this district. -Owen Sound Sun-Times.

Make Father Support Child

Ontario Government Plans to End Double Morality Standard. The Ontario Government has a bill already drafted, which will make the fathers of illegitimate children jointly responsible for their support. A deputation representing various social agencies in Toronto waited upon the Government and were somewhat surprised when they found that legislation was almost ready to carry out one of their principal recommendations. They were met by Attorney-General Raney, Hon. Walter Hullo and Provincial Secretary Nixon. Mr. Stapleton, the principle underlying the recommendation was to eliminate the double standard of morality, which leaves the burden of caring for illegitimate children on the mother or on the public. He also stated that from estimates made by social workers, there were in the neighborhood of from 400 to 500 of these children yearly. The deputation also asked that a deputy minister of labor be appointed who has proper qualifications in the way of social service training and experience and that an advisory board be appointed under the chairmanship of the Deputy Minister of Labor, composed of various representatives from all the social agencies to serve in a voluntary capacity.

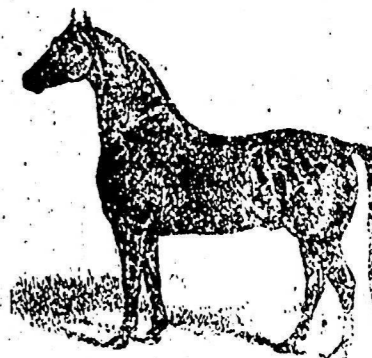
