The most encouraging feature of the young tamarack is its rapid rate of growth as compared with its common associate, black spruce. An officer of the Commission of Conservation examined several young tamarack trees which were growing on a sand ridge a few feet above the level of an adjoining swamp. These trees averaged 22 years old and were from 15 to 18 feet high. They were between the ground. The interesting feature the last few years. At the present rate of growth of there young trees, there will in the near future be a new supply of tamarack fence posts and even railway ties in the territory described above. Curly Hair for Keeping Cool.

Examination of the furs of different animals shows that those with straight-haired pelts live in the northean sections of the world, while those with curly, crinkly fur come from the warmer climates—just as those which or brown hair inhabit the more temperate climakes.

The reason for this is that the fur of northern animals is intended to keep its wearers warm, while the function of the fur of animals which live in trepleal climates is to protect them from the direct rays of the sun, a resailt accomplished by the curls, and kinks of the black or brown fur. .

The hair of a human being serves the same purpose as the fur of the lower animals. The original home of the negro being Africa, it was necessary that he should have some protection from the heat. 




