By his will he bequeaths his wife, Lillian Gertrude Richards, a life interest in his \$24,192 estate. His daughters, Lillian Gertrude Richards and Helen C. Richards, will inherit upon their mother's death. The \$4,000 insurance upon the life of his brother, George, of which his estate is the beneficiary is to be maintained. His estate included a \$4000 interest in a Manning avenue property, a \$3000 property in Alberta, land in Melancthon township, \$2,000 cash and insurance, \$9,257 3/4 shares of Goodyear, \$2,100, and a mortgage, \$1,200.

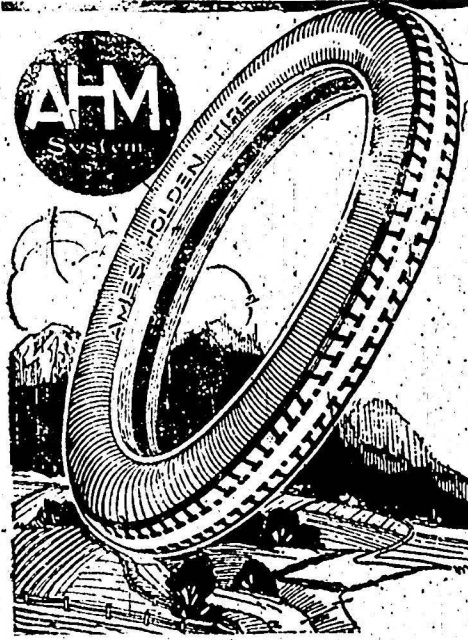

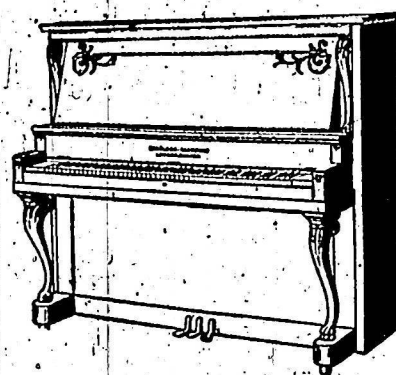
