Death of Thomas Newlove

Loreburn (Sask.) Herald, Sept. 19th.
All in Loreburn and its community were shocked and genuinely grieved to hear of the sudden death of Mr. Thomas Newlove on Thursday afternoon last.

The day preceding, Mr. Newlove met with an accident. He was returning home from town on a grain tank, when in passing a car his horses shied, throwing him under the wheels which went over his body. He did not lose consciousness and was taken to his home by A. A. French. At the time it was not known how serious the injuries were, but internal trouble was feared and this resulted in his death the following afternoon.

Mr. Newlove was sixty-eight years of age, born in Markdale, Ont., in 1853. Later in life he moved to Creemore, Ont., where he conducted a grist mill for many years. In 1891 he was married to Miss Margaret Asaph of the same place.

In 1910 he came west with his family and settled in the Loreburn district, where he became a successful farmer and the owner of several prosperous farms.

Deceased is survived by his widow and three sons, Carl, Harold and Robert, who were all home at the time of his death.

The funeral took place on Sunday afternoon, a short service being held at the house, followed by a service in St. John's Church, conducted by Rev. T. W. Jones. While the roads were almost impassable, so many gathered to pay their last respects to one so generally mourned, that many were unable to get inside the church. Beautiful floral tributes were received from the following: Women Grain Growers, W. A. of St. John's Church, Rev. T. W. Jones, His Neighbors, Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Mathers of Moose Jaw, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Martin, Mr. and Mrs. J. I. Schumann, Mr. and Mrs. W. P. Hill—also a beautiful cross from Mrs. Newlove and spray from the family. Interment was in the Loreburn cemetery.

Mr. Newlove was a man of sterling character and genial nature, and his loss is one felt by many friends. Very deep sympathy is extended to the family so sadly and suddenly bereaved.
