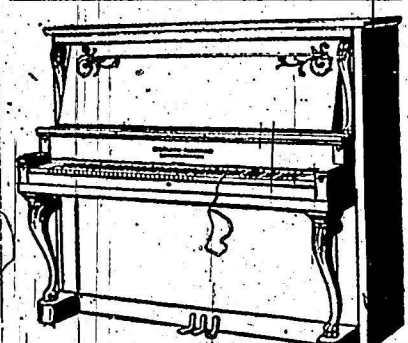

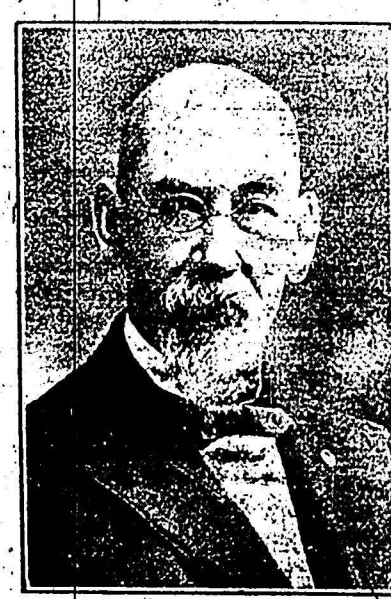
Millions Now Living Will Never Die
