Since very ancient time sandglasses ave been used for timing the boiling of eggs. Even nowadays they are inmmon use for this purpose in hotels ind restaurants. A new twist is given to the idea by

William A. Corbett, of Winnipeg. He nakes the eggs time themselves, and, when they are cooked, lift themselves out of the bolling water-with the help of a modification of the sandglass The device for the purpose is a tube

containing a number of lead balls. It is attached by a little bracket to the dge of a sancepan; and from the end of it is suspended a wire basket to hold the eggs in the boiling water. A branch of the tube contains a sandglass, in such a position that the upper bulb of the latter keeps the lead balls in place. But this upper bulb is made of rubber and, when the sand has run out of it, it collapses, allowing the balls to run down into the hollow handle of the tube. The transfer of their weight to the handle causes the end of the tube to rise and lift the eggcontaining basket out of the water.


