### Department of Agriculture

As the year is drawing to a close, the time for making application for Premiums is rapidly shortening. The Grey County Department of Agriculture, Markdale, is receiving some every week. To those who have purchased a Registered Ram for the first time, the Federal Department of Agriculture, Ottawa will give \$5.00 this year and \$5.00 next. All applications must be made before December 31st.

### School Fair Letters

In an endeavour to secure the cooperation of all the schools in Grey County, the Department of Agriculture, Markdale, is sending a letter to all the teachers in the schools which were not engaged in School Fair work during 1921. The request was made that these letters be distributed to the children. The letters are being distributed so that the people can read them and learn the facts of the School Fair Work. From past experience, we know that the majority of schools, once engaged in the work, do not care to drop the Fair. The Department hopes for a large increase in 1922.

### Short Courses at Chatsworth and

During January, the Department of Agriculture, Markdale, will conduct a Four Weeks' Course at Chatsworth and Dundalk. The latter named is a jointly conducted course, in co-operation with the Department of Agriculture, Orangeville. Folders have been sent out relative to the Courses. At these Courses, practical demonstrations on Stock and Seed Judging, Milk Testing, Weed Seed Identification and other things relating to agriculture are given. Members of the class will be eligible to enter Judging Competitions at Toronto and Guelph. Winners will receive substantial prizes. Other Competitions are Beef Feeding, Day Profit, Profit Acre, Plowing, Etc. The prize in this will be a two weeks free course at the O.A.C. in Stock and Seed Judging. Domestic Science and Home Nursing Courses for the ladies will also be held. Last January these proved the most popular as there were 114 in the Domestic Science and 154 in the Home Nursing Courses at Durham. The Courses are worth while, as they are practical and designed to give information that the average woman is seeking for, whether she comes from the farm or town.
