As most crop-growers are aware, some of the failures in securing satisfactory crops are due to the planting of seed having poon vitality. This is particularly true with corn, which is one of the most easily damaged seeds. The testing of corn and other seed before planting is well worth while because of the assurance it gives that

a good crop stand will be obtained. The testing of farm seeds is not a difficult matter and may be done by planting one hundred or two hundred grains in a flower pot or box of seil, which should be kept moist, but not wet, and in a sunny window for a week or so at about the temperature of a living room. If, however, one lacks confidence in his ability to test the vitality of seed in this way, advantage may be taken of the service Department of Agriculture at O'tawa.
