Answer: A laying hen requires about four ounces of feed per day. This, should be equally, divided between scratch feed and dry mash. Trouble will be experienced in enequal proportion of scratch and mash inless the feeding practice so regulates the amount of scratch feed given that the hens will consume the mash to satisfy their appetites. A light feed of equal parts of cracked cern and wheat in the morning, and a heavy feed of two parts corn and one of wheat in the evening is recommended. The most palatable form of green food is sprouted loats; however, mangels, cabbage, etc. could be used as a substitute. The green food usually has a tonic effect on the hen and increases, the appetite of the fowl; therefore, green food should be fed preferably in the morn-
