Cattle Trade Needs

In this review of live stock market conditions in August the Dominion Live Stock Branch makes the following points: "The dried up conditions of pasture in Ontario and Quebec was more or less responsible for the heavy conditions of thin stock very fairly good in practically all districts and not much as to induce any liquidation. Prospects for autumn and winter are very bright and the holdings are not nearly so heavy as during the autumn of 1922. It would appear to be good business to keep the movement of stock during September and October free of light mid-western stock. The cattle that have been forward in weight and finish, possibly more than in any other year, are now in stock for the export trade. They have neither the floating market nor the ability to ship. The market is being very heavily and butcher, does not want to buy stock of poor doing to market and can only do so at a price which the packers are unable to meet. A lot of care is being taken to get this wool into the market in the cold weather and before the heavy amount of poor quality stock is available. A strong demand is being made for good stock and better work of foot and sound in more outside stock. Therefore, add by the producer that return a suitable price."



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
