## Car Stolen

Mr. Albert Buchanan, who attends High School here, had his Ford car stolen on Friday afternoon last and up to the time of going to press no trace of it has been found. He drives it from Vandeleur each morning and leaves the car in the shed during the day. On Thursday evening when getting started for home he noticed two strangers in the shed working at an old car which appeared to be giving trouble but thought nothing of it until after his car had disappeared.

The car was noticed by Robert Down, the man who had it made at the hill end of Vandeleur. The driver then turned east towards Maxwell, when no trace was seen in the glare of moonlight. It was discovered later that it was the car of a young man named Ohlman, who it is said is one of the five who escaped from the Ontario Penitentiary at Guelph early last week.
