

6. The dry mixture of grain is composed of equal parts of corp meal and good shorts' which suits the digestive organs of the chicks. This lacks animal food and vitamines.

To make this apparently a com plete food is to moisten the dry mixture in the first feed with canned tomatoes: the second with raw eggs and the third with hashed liver, then hegin the series over again. This will not satisfy the chick but it gives a chance for the chick to absorb completely the yolk in the body.

7. After the first period the chicks should be fed three times a day all they will eat.

8. When a week old begin giving a drinking vessel of water and another of sour milk. Better not give any milk for the first four days.

9. After the second week sprouted grain may be fed, also a little cracked grain. Make change from tomatoes and liver to sprouted grains or tender grass gradually. If leg weakness develops, the tomatoes and sprouted grains should be increased or the chicks put outdoors on clean tender


