Annual Meeting

of the Markdale Auxiliary to the British and Foreign Bible Society
 The annual meeting of the Markdale Auxiliary to the British and Foreign Bible Society was held in the Armouries, on Sunday evening, June 15th, after the regular Church services. The attendance was in the neighborhood of 125, being a great improvement upon the showing of last year. The members of last year's executive were re-elected, with the exception that Mr. A. L. Walker was appointed to be the Presbyterian representative instead of Mr. Carrol Walden who had removed from town. The gathering then listened attentively to a splendid address by the Rev. S. G. Pinnock, the representative of the Ontario Branch of the Society. The speaker, who has given a great many years of service as a missionary in Africa, was able, from his own intimate knowledge of people and conditions in that part of the world, to present his hearers with a most informing and inspiring treatment of the case for African evangelization. In the course of his address, he pointed out the leading place taken by the British and Foreign Bible Society in the dissemination of Christian knowledge and the Christian faith. Mr. Pinnock, who has a fine platform presence, a fluent delivery and a fervor tempered with dignified restraint, deeply impressed his hearers, both at the meeting in the Armouries and in two of the local Church services of which he had charge. Those who found it impossible to be present at the evening rally missed a great deal.

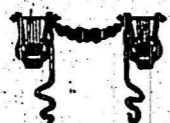
Decoration Service

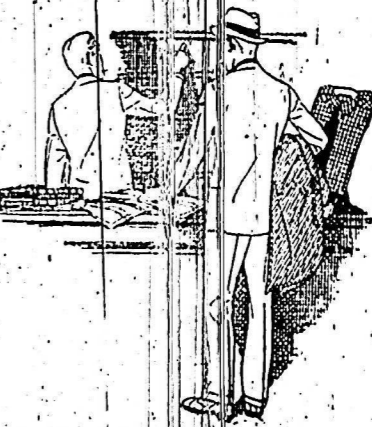
