Owen Sound, Jan. 27.—Thomas R. McKenzie, Reeve of Artemesia, was chosen as Warden of the County of Grey at the inaugural meeting of the Grey County Council this afternoon. Only one vote was necessary to ensure the election of Mr. McKenzie, although there were two other candidates, Reeves Horn of Normandy and Miller of Ephraisa. Reeves George A. Bothwell of Sdenham, W. W. Smith of Shallow Lake and Robert White of St. Vincent were nominated, but declined. The new warden has seen 17 years' service in the County Council, and has served as chairman of several of the most important committees of the Council. He is 65 years of age, a Presbyterian, and a conservative, and has resided in Artemesia Township all his life.

Mrs. Angus McLachlan Dead

Markdale and vicinity were shocked on Sunday by the death of Mrs. Angus McLachlan, who passed away at the home of Dr. McFarlane Arthur, where she and her husband had been visiting. She had retired well as usual, but during the night was stricken with an attack of acute indigestion which proved fatal. Mr. and Mrs. McLachlan have resided in Markdale for the past three years where Mr. McLachlan is employed by F. T. Hill & Co.
Mrs. McLachlan, who was a daughter of Mr. Hugh McKinnon, South Glenora, and besides her husband and daughter, Marie, aged four years, she leaves five brothers, Archie and Donald in Saskatchewan, Malcolm in Regina, and Charles and Lachlan at home, and two sisters, Sarah (Mrs. John Jones) of Saskatchewan and Belle (Mrs. Hector McLean) near Bellefleur. Another sister, Hannah, (the late Mrs. John Scott) predeceased her a few years ago.
Interment took place last Wednesday at McNeill's Cemetery, Rev. A. Sutherland conducting mortuary service, being assisted in the church service by Rev. Dr. Gray, pastor of the deceased and her husband while residing here.

Death of W. J. Benson

W. J. Benson died at his home, 46 High Park Boulevard, Wednesday, January 22nd, at the age of 62 years. He had been a resident of Toronto for the past 12 years, and was a well known merchant. The late Mr. Benson was born in Markdale, where he received his education and started in business as a merchant. At 30 years of age he left Markdale and was in business successfully in Dundas, Sheffington, Cherry Grove, Owen Sound and Indian Head, Sask. In 1923 he received and since lived in Toronto. He was a member of High Park Methodist Church, and was a popular member of the High Park Bowling Club, where he took a keen interest in bowling and curling. He was married Miss Agnes Henry of Owen Sound, who survives him. Three sisters and two brothers also survive: Mrs. E. H. Eastman of Los Angeles; Mrs. E. H. Woods of Cleveland, Ohio; Mrs. Jas. S. Row of Brantford; T. E. Benson, Los Angeles; and R. H. Benson, St. George's, Ontario. The funeral service was held at his late residence at 8 p.m., Friday, and interment took place at Markdale on Saturday following the arrival of the noon train. Rev. Mr. Bovee conducted the burial service in the mortuary chapel. Messrs R. H. Benson, body from Toronto; D. Campbell accompanied the pallbearers, Mr. Dundak.
