Harvey White, who was on the mound for the locals was replaced by Murph Mercer in the second innings and the latter held the visitors to two runs in the last seven innings. In the opening frame Jimmie Noble, Gordon Beaton and Harold Beard went out in one, two, three order. Harvey White made first safely in the second but was caught off his base and Harold Beard made the circuit and H. Mercer and M. Littlejohns were out at first. In the third Jimmy Noble walked to first but was caught trying to steal second. Gordon Beaton was struck out, Harold Beard was left at second when Harvey White was out at first. Bowler, Mercer and Sullivan were left out bases when Littlejohns was struck out and Noble was retired on a fly.
