TO PRESERVE THE EGG

MAY BE KEPT FRESH WITHOUT
COOLD STORAGE.
Water Glass and Lime Water May Be
Used—When to Preserve—Packing
—Don't Feed Carcasses to Live
Stocks.

of Agriculture, Toronto.)

A household poultry well worth
while may be practiced by all house-
wives during the period when eggs
are most abundant and cheap. The
high prices generally ruling during
the period October to March puts the
extensive use of new laid eggs be-
yond the reach of people with limited
incomes. However, all may have
eggs for dining use by putting down
a few dollars in a suitable preserva-
tive medium, and thereby supplying
the need during the period of scarce-
ty. It does not pay to put down
large quantities of eggs over the
period of high prices.
