The vote was, Johnston 151, Colgan 194. Three members of the Council have been elected by acclamation, namely: J. E. England, Gerrard Scott and Elmer Tuck. A new nomination will be required to fill the vacancy on the Council and two vacancies on the Public School Board.

ARTEMESIA
