Simple. Maintaining some form of account nir is absolutely necessary if the farmer is to be sure that he is farming in the most profitable way. It is the only way to ascertain what return his farm should yield in order to make a profit over production cost, and it is a guide to the farmer in deciding which particular lines of work are profitable and which are not. With the object of supplying a simple and officient form of farm accounting which will take up little time yet will enable one to keep a correct record of his affairs, the Dept. of Agriculture at Ottawa has published a small account book designed to cover a year's work It gives directions for the making of entries and the taking of inventories and requires no special knowledge of accounting. It may be obtained for 10 cents from the Publications Bracch.
