Early in the year 1850, then a child of only three years of age, Alice Walker came with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Walker, from Bathurst to Lanark, where she was born. The family settled on the corner lot, part of which is still owned by Mr. Oswald Walker, a son of Mr. George Walker. Their first home was a very humble affair, rather roughly constructed from the rough logs of the native forest and situated where Christ Church now stands. Later a more pretentious home was built, where the Bank of Toronto is located and was considered rather wonderful in that it had an upper-stair.
