**PLANES TO CARRY INCOMING MAILS**

**NEW ELEVATOR FOR PORT ARTHUR**

**Arrival of Letters Will Be Advanced Many Hours.**

Ottawa.—The Postmaster-General has formally authorized the experiments which are being made to speed up the new system for the carrying of British mails from the Atlantic seaboard.

At the present season of Parliament \$25,000 was appropriated for the purchase of two up-to-date airplanes to be used in this service, although others as well will probably be utilized.

The experiments are to be conducted under the direction of the Air Board and they will begin September 1 when planes will meet incoming ships at Plover Point and have transferred to them the letter mails. Halifax and St. John also figure in the plan. Between Plover Point and Quebec it is calculated that eight hours will be saved by this form of transmission, while between Plover Point and Montreal, the Air Board is to provide the necessary aids to aerial navigation while careful work will be taken of meteorological and other conditions. It is expected that four months will suffice for the tests from the Atlantic ports. By the end of the year, in the light of the data secured, a test for a regular service will be conducted. It is the idea that the contract should be let at the opening of St. Lawrence navigation next year. The new system will materially shorten the handling of mail and transcontinental mails to Canada and also the southern Dominion.

Arrangements for the initial service will go ahead at once in order to provide for a start by September 1.

**Great Structure to be Erected by United Grain Growers.**

Port Arthur, Ont.—Announcement has been made by the United Grain Growers' elevator company regarding immediate construction at Port Arthur of a new elevator to be erected by the United Grain Growers of Canada's great industry.

The United Grain Growers announce a new elevator with a total capacity of 500,000 bushels and the United Grain Growers' elevator company announces plans for additions to their present plants, totaling 1,000,000 bushels.

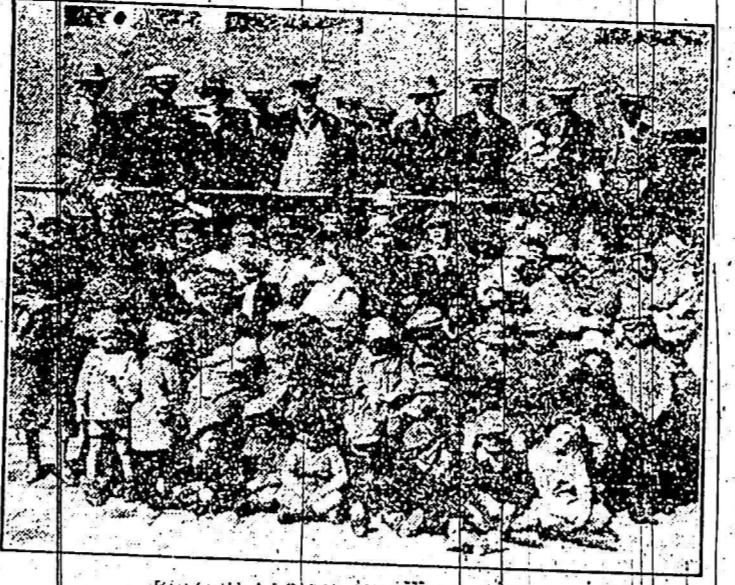
The work represented in the decision of the United Grain Growers to build a new elevator at Port Arthur represents the largest single contract for elevator capacity that has ever been awarded in Canada for elevator.

A significant feature of the situation is that the Grain Growers, having had the construction of such a plant in mind for some time, after watching the development of the grain trade and the situation at Port Arthur, decided to build the new elevator on the route via Eastern Canada.

In addition to being a large elevator, it is planned to include a flour mill and will incorporate the features of a flour mill, especially the roller system, and will be equipped with a number of elevators of different capacities, including a number of elevators of 20,000 bushels capacity, which can be used for the purpose of elevating grain to the elevators of the Grain Growers' elevator company.

The new elevator will be built on the site of the old elevator, and will be built under the supervision of C. D. Howe & Co. of Port Arthur. General contract for the work has been awarded to Carter & Hall, Adjoining Co., Ltd., of Winnipeg.

Orders for piles and pile driving work have been placed and work will commence immediately. About 15,000 piles are required.



**BRITISH LEGION SETTLERS ARRIVE**

One of the finest single parties to swell Canadian population arrived in Canada recently at Quebec aboard the Canadian Pacific steamer Montreal. The party of five families numbering about 100 persons in all came to Canada under the auspices of the British Legion Service League, being the first to be sent to Canada through this immigration scheme.

The men are all ex-servicemen and are highly dependable types of men. They are all from the United Kingdom and are being sent to Canada on account of the fact that they had been in the service of the Ministry of Labor's Training Farm at Brandon, Suffern, England. They had been instructed in various branches of agriculture to enable them to meet the conditions in this country as they find them.

**UNITED CHURCH GAVE \$3,100,000**

Sum Was Subscribed for Maintenance and Extension Fund.

Toronto.—Giving by congregations of the United Church of Canada in the maintenance and extension fund for the year ended March 31, total slightly more than \$3,100,000, with an increase of more than 10 per cent over the previous year, was reported at a conference of New York and London delegates held here last week. The objective of \$3,400,000, which was submitted to and adopted by Presbyteries and Pastoral charges, was made up of the \$2,250,000 for regular work and \$1,150,000 for emergency work in addition to the \$1,200,000 already in hand from the congregations in the form of receipts of \$125,000 from special sources.

Analyzing the returns, Rev. Dr. Bryce, secretary of the maintenance and extension fund, said that 14 city congregations in Toronto, Montreal, Hamilton, London and Winnipeg, which had topped the list in aggregate amounts, had averaged nearly \$17,000 each. Dr. Bryce said the whole result was a sign of the loyalty of United Church people to the enterprises of their church. He considered it a remarkable achievement.

Dr. Bryce has left for the west, where he will address the conference of the United Church during the next few weeks.

**CANADIAN BANKS IN GOOD POSITION**

Sign of Improved Conditions and Prosperity is Noted.

Ottawa.—According to reports which come to the banking division of the finance department, Canadian banks were never in a more liquid position. Since the failure of the Home Bank there have been no banking disasters and in fact the Bank Act provides such safeguards as make this impossible without the conditions being well known in advance and arrangements made to cope with it.

In recent years, however, the period of depression caused some of the banks to be led up to assets upon which their advances could not readily be liquidated.

It is considered a hopeful sign of improved conditions and returning prosperity that in almost every case the situation has been wholly overcome and the liquid position of the banks re-established to the level of very prosperous days.

**UNIVERSITY GETS VALUABLE SITE FOR EXTENSION**

Big Land Purchase in London Was Made Possible by the Rockefeller Foundation.

London.—London University had acquired a Bloomsbury site of 112 acres in the heart of the metropolis. This means that 10,000 British and foreign students will have the longness of permanent headquarters in touch with all that is best in British educational life.

This satisfactory solution of a problem which has troubled generations of British educators was brought about by American generosity in announcing that Lord Keynes, President of the Board of Education, referred to the Rockefeller Foundation, which had made with the purchase from the Duke of Bedford possible.

The price is understood to have been £500,000. Rockefeller Foundation contributing half, a substantial amount to the building fund. The scheme does not involve interference with King's College, which has been the snag whereon previous proposals of acquiring the site have been shipwrecked. It is thus welcomed by all parties to the big controversy.

The Times, referring to the Rockefeller Foundation, says that such an act of generosity and imagination could have come only from the United States. "A land where old men not only see dreams but are rich enough to turn them into realities."

**MOTOR INVASION NORTH TO SOUTH**

New Motor Highway Into New Ontario to be Fittingly Opened.

Timmins, Ont.—Arrangements are being made to organize a gigantic motor trek from Northern Ontario to Toronto in August, or the beginning of September.

Mr. Alex. Dewar, president of the Associated Boards of Trade of Northern Ontario, has written the various municipalities of the North asking them to elect representatives to attend an organization meeting to be held in the near future.

The suggestion of the motor parade was made by the Hon. William Finlayson on his visit to the North, when he stated that upon the completion of the new trunk highway he would extend an invitation to all motorists of the North to visit Toronto and participate in Northern Ontario Day at the Canadian National Exhibition.

He also suggested that the business men of the North should make an effort to bring settlers and their families in their cars to demonstrate to the people of lower Ontario the wonderful possibilities that were to be obtained in the northern section of the province.

It is understood that practically every town north of North Bay is already making preliminary arrangements for the invasion of the south by road.
