most negligible for the same reason. There is an adequate set of instruments on the control panel to provide for complete control of the power house's several functions. So every machine, no matter what its size, has its individual power plant in the form of an electric motor. Some machines, such as huge cranes employed for handling materials, employ several motors. Every portion of electrical energy used to operate these machines, as well as that required for lighting and inter-department communication devices, is furnished by this giant power house which also provides all the steam required for many manufacturing processes and for heating, also all the hot water employed in heating certain portions of the plant. The power plant also pumps all the water used by the industry and operates a refrigeration system used in conjunction with the drinking water supply system.

The cost of power in this plant is said to be one cent per kilowatt. The cost is lower in winter when the demands for steam and hot water for heating is at a peak. This variation is due to the skillful design of the plant by virtue of which every thermal unit in every ton of coal is exploited to the greatest possible extent. When the demands for steam and hot water are low the consumption of coal for power production alone becomes relatively heavier.

The power capacity of this huge power house is 15,000 kilowatts, but its normal load is in the neighborhood of 6,000 kilowatts. The Edison system employed is the most complete known and every thermal unit is unloaded at the Company's dock which is some six hundred feet from the power-house. The steam is handled by an immense gantry crane which, under pressure, could move about three hundred tons per hour. The gantry picks up the coal with a five ton clam shell scoop and transfers it to a hopper. When the hopper is loaded the coal is lifted to about two hundred feet long moves to a point where the hopper can be emptied into crushed located underground. The coal is crushed and conveyed by and endless belt through a long tunnel to the power plant. There it is pulverized to about the consistency of talcum powder and is carried to the top of the building and blown into three huge furnaces. There are six feeders to each furnace and the coal, mixed with the correct proportion of air, burns much in the fashion of a vaporized oil. Draft from floor and are notable principally for an almost complete absence of smoke, combustion being so thorough that little gas escapes unburned. The ash residue in the furnace is almost negligible for the same reason.
