

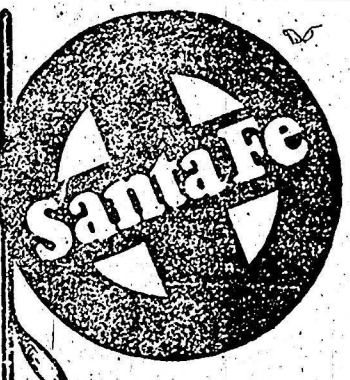

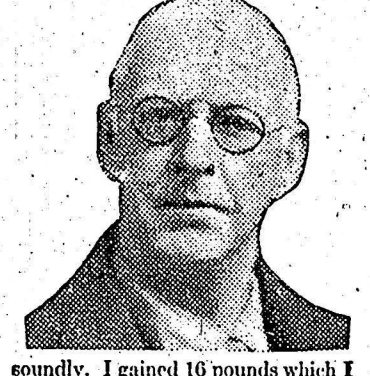

London Exhibits Nine-Inch Hyacinth.

What is said to be the largest hyacinth in the world, "Myosotis," was the cynosure of all eyes at the show of the Royal Horticultural Society in Vincent Square, London, Eng. The bloom, a mass of tiny blue bells, was also inches in diameter.

The hyacinth was sometimes known to the English trade as the "chimney-sweep's brush." He continued, "The development of hyacinths in England has been wonderful during recent years. Blooming in the height of the season, it is not generally known that the hyacinth, centuries ago, was a tiny wild flower. As you see, we have now hyacinths in practically every color. Perhaps brilliant orange and scarlet are the most novel colors we have not yet perfected in these blooms, although we have them in shaded orange and cerise. 'King Menckin,' a deep indigo blue, is among the hyacinths being shown this year, and this is about the nearest we have got to a black hyacinth."

Hyacinths are still used largely for window-boxes—a method of decoration popular in the British Isles. In addition to hyacinths, which formed a greater part of the show, there were daffodils, marigolds and orchids. Sir William Lawrance exhibited a rare plant known as Halmuthus nutans. This plant, which possesses an orange-colored flower, is a native of South Africa.

Coast to Coast Radio Reception.

There is a distant air line from Vancouver to Halifax and hitherto the radio experts have had difficulty in traversing it by broadcast. The feat has been performed at last and the honor of the performance belongs to CNRV, the Vancouver broadcast station of the Radio Department, Canadian National Railways. G. W. Rockwell, 42 Phillip Street, Halifax, a member of the Halifax County Radio Association, was the fortunate enthusiast engaged in a contest for "DX" reception. Mr. Rockwell remained up until the "last" hour, one night recently and tuned in on CNRV broadcasting a dance orchestra when they were playing "In a Little Spanish Town." It was at 2:20 a.m. o'clock, Atlantic Standard Time, that this occurred. In Vancouver, where Pacific Time reigns and they called 10:20 p.m. on the log of the previous evening. The reception has been verified, and A. R. McEwan, Director of Radio, Canadian National Railways, states that the occasion is the first on which a Canadian broadcasting station has covered the long distance from coast to coast.

Cure for Auto Accidents.

Education is the only cure for the accidents, writes Walter P. Chrysler in The Outlook. "The more I study this, the more I am convinced that a major part of the problem is an educational one. That this is recognized is to be found in the fact that in many of our large cities, police officers are going into the schools to give blackboard talks to children about crossing streets at crossings, the necessity for observing traffic lights, the dangers of playing in crowded streets, the folly of 'hooking-on' motor cars and trucks and busses and what not. Having police officers in uniform go into classrooms has its effect."

"This practice of having the police go into the schools should be encouraged. Many cities would do well to adopt the plan. But the work of the police must be supplemented by the instruction of the parents in the home. Mr. Chrysler also believes that the motorist needs education. He writes: 'The motorist loses nothing who gives to the pedestrian the right of way. It is the courteous thing to do. And then one should remember that a pedestrian cannot see going into the streets about a vigorous motorist, a child, a motorist who compels the pedestrian to run to escape injury. To be sure, there are all kinds of motorists, just as there are all kinds of pedestrians, but the decent thing to do is to permit the pedestrian to walk to the curb or across the street in safety and without hurry.'"
