England and Egypt Nearing Agreement

Important Decisions Expected in Cairo From the Current Negotiations

Cairo, Dec. 24.—The political situation in Egypt since the return of Lord Cromer, Sarwat Pasha, has given rise to considerable speculation regarding the future of the country. Official circles are observing the utmost reticence regarding the precise nature of the negotiations which took place in London and are being followed up here between the Premier and the British High Commission, but certain reports which have found their way into the press make it clear that developments of a far-reaching character are in progress.

According to the Al-Mokattam, a leading daily which is generally well informed, Sarwat, while in London, succeeded in allaying the fears of the British Government regarding public security in Egypt, should British troops be withdrawn from the capital to the Suez Canal. He further obtained the British assent to modification of the capitulatory regime, provided other powers would agree, and succeeded in getting Great Britain to give up the idea of taking part in the protection of foreigners.

After the conclusion of an Anglo-Egyptian treaty whereby the status quo which preceded the murder of the Sirdar will be restored, Great Britain will support Egypt's candidature for the League of Nations and would not object to an increase in the Egyptian army so as to enable Egypt herself to defend the Suez Canal.

# Sunday School Lesson

January 1. John the Baptist and Jesus, Mark 1: 1-13. Golden Text—He must increase, but I must decrease.—John 3: 30.

ANALYSIS

I. SIGNS OF THE TIMES: JOHN THE BAPTIST PROCLAIMS THE COMING OF THE MESSIAH, 1-8.

II. HOW JESUS WAS REVEALED TO HIMSELF, 9-11.

INTRODUCTION—None of our evangelists have been able to tell the story of Jesus without a preliminary reference to the mission and work of John the Baptist. The reasons of this are obvious. 1. The work of John formed the historical preparation for the work of Jesus. 2. John's preaching led him above all the people to Jesus. 3. Jesus discovered his own vocation. He came to John for baptism, bending his head, so to speak, to the authority of John's message, and at that moment God's higher summons to himself took place.

John the Baptist is one of the most extraordinary figures in the history of Israel. Prophecy, which in the past seemed to have been a mere message in his thrilling and impassioned message and our Lord, as we know, regarded him above all the prophets. (Matt. 11: 7-14. Like the prophet Elijah, he came from the desert, and frowned on the soft and corrupt life of cities. Like Elijah, he summoned the people to decide for God, and to do with evil. Even his dress and manner recalled the ancient prophet. But his announcement of the imminent coming of the Messiah was new. It had been supernaturally revealed to John that the Day of Judgment, the Day of the Lord, was at hand, and he came forward summoning men to repent.

I. SIGNS OF THE TIMES: JOHN THE BAPTIST PROCLAIMS THE COMING OF THE MESSIAH, 1-8.

V. 1. The words are equivalent to "Here begins the joyful news concerning Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God." Note that Mark, which is the earliest Gospel, does not speak of Jesus' birth, but confines itself to his baptism, which began with his baptism by John.

V. 2. The Christian church sees in the mission of John the fulfillment of ancient prophecies. Two such prophecies are here quoted. The first is from Malachi 3: 1, and refers to the expectation of Elijah's return, Malachi 4: 5. As the reader will notice, the language has been slightly changed. Instead of "before me" we have "before thee" (a reference to Christ), because John prepares the way for Christ. John is a herald who announces the king's return, and urges preparation for it. The second quotation is from Isaiah 40: 3. This prophecy was originally uttered at the time of Israel's release from Babylon. The prophet here has a voice commanding that a road be built across the desert, by which Israel may return to Zion. This is now regarded as a prediction of John's preaching, which interested in such Old Testament prophecies of Christian history, and called them "testimonies."

V. 3. John instituted the ceremonial rite of baptism as a sacrament of cleansing from past sins. He was dealing with many who had lived had put themselves beyond the pale of the ordinary legal purifications. (The second half of the verse indicates the purpose of baptism, i.e., repentance, and pointing forward to the remission of sins.)

V. 4. The national character of John's baptism is stressed, and report spread throughout the whole land.

V. 5. John's ascetic dress and diet are emphasized because they recalled Elijah (2 Kings 1: 8), and because they added to the impressiveness of his appeal.

V. 6. John proclaimed the coming of the Messiah, the Son of God, and the people were waiting for him. John did not yet know that Jesus would be the Messiah. The words about the Messiah's "coming" somewhat John counted himself less than a slave in comparison with the Messiah. It was a slave's duty to unloose and carry his master's shoes.

V. 7. It was believed that the Spirit would be bestowed in the last or Messianic days, Joel 2: 28-32. So John announces that the coming One will baptize with the Spirit and with water, but with the Spirit.

V. 8. Note the simplicity with which Jesus' coming to John is announced. It is said as to his personality, character, or appearance. Now is anything said about his motive in seeking baptism. But the Christian church, for which the gospel is written, needs no explanations. It knows Jesus as Redeemer, and it believes that he gave himself for sinners. Therefore it finds no difficulty in the thought that Jesus numbered himself with the transgressors at Jordan.

V. 9. Now comes the reason why all this is so solemnly recorded. Jesus ising from the water, had a wondrous vision. He saw the heavens opened, and the Spirit of God coming down upon him like a descending dove. How rare to understand the nature of this holy experience? The opening heavens mean that the great mystery of God has at last revealed itself to the soul of Jesus. He sees into the heart of God and he knows God's purpose for humanity. He feels that he is unworshiped and directed by the Spirit of God, impelling him to labor for man's salvation.

V. 10. Now comes the reason why all this is so solemnly recorded. Jesus ising from the water, had a wondrous vision. He saw the heavens opened, and the Spirit of God coming down upon him like a descending dove. How rare to understand the nature of this holy experience? The opening heavens mean that the great mystery of God has at last revealed itself to the soul of Jesus. He sees into the heart of God and he knows God's purpose for humanity. # Carving

## Proper Style Necessary to Handle the New Year Turkey

To carve the bird with power, smoothness and accuracy is necessary to have a correct position with respect to the bird. The thing to do is to take a comfortable position, feet firmly planted on a line with the bird, elbows at the side, purely facing the platter. There are many variations of the stance, but the important thing is for the carver to be directly over the bird. Do not get too far away nor too close.

Nothing is more important in bird carving than mental poise. Probably nine-tenths of the atrocious carving done at Canadian dinners is directly attributable to the so-called "mental hazard." An amazing number of people approach the bird in a state of mental agitation and confusion. They are all-of-a-futter. Their eyes thought is to let fly and trust to luck.

Now without perfect coordination of mind and muscle no bird can be carved with that smoothness and precision that mark the play of the really good carver.

1—This is all quiet contemplation. There is nothing to worry about. 2—I am cool and relaxed. 3—I don't care how many eyes are watching me. I am fit to be the master of my knife.

Go keep steady, taking care not to close to the carver's eye. When you feel that the knife is back the necessary distance bring it back through the same arc. Head starts first, the arm follows and the hand follows the arm.

# GOOD HOLIDAY RECIPES

## Prepares a duck for baking. Cut it into several pieces and place in a baking pan.

Into a strong chicken broth boiling hot mix two cups of chopped celery, two bay leaves, salt and pepper to season. Pour this over the duck and cook one and one-half hours, turning the pieces of duck when one side is done. Then add two tablespoons of butter. Stir until it boils, then add two tablespoons of tomato catsup, one-half cup of cooked mushrooms, one-half teaspoon of salt and pepper and four tablespoons of sherry. Pour the sauce over the pieces of duck arranged on a hot platter. Garnish the platter with squares of toast, each square garnished with a cube currant or guava jelly.

## Broiled Duck Liver.

Marinate duck livers in a French dressing and allow them to rest in it for fifteen minutes, then broil. Serve with melted butter sauce.

## Cranberry Jelly With Celery.

To one quart of washed cranberries add two cups of sugar and one cup of boiling water. Bring to the boiling point and boil for twenty minutes. Strain through a sieve. When the mixture begins to congeal add one and one-half cups of celery, cut into thin slices crosswise. Turn into a mold and chill. When serving, turn out the mold and garnish with crisp celery cuts.

## Pumpkin Pie With Honey.

One and one-half cups of steamed and strained pumpkin, one cup of honey, one teaspoon of cinnamon, one-half teaspoon of ginger, one-half teaspoon of salt, two eggs, one cup of milk and one-half cup of sweet cream. Mix the ingredients in the order given and bake in one crust. Garnish each piece of pie with a little whipped cream with a drop of honey in the center.

## Potash Enough For 250 Years Found in Texas

Deposits Contain Magnesium, Sodium and Sulphates of Potassium. Professors Tell Chemical Society

Oil Town Near New-Find Power, Labor and Necessary Supplies to be Had from Odessa, Report Points Out

Adrian, Tex., Dec. 24.—Potash deposits large enough to supply America's needs for 250 years have been discovered in western Texas. Dr. H. E. Scliar, and Dr. E. P. School, of the University of Texas, have reported to the American Chemical Society. In the past the United States has depended on Germany for potash.

The search for the compound in this field was begun by J. A. Cullen, of the University of Texas. He suspected the presence of potash in the cause here, just as in Germany, there was once a Permian Sea which has been cut off from the rest of the ocean and has evaporated in dryness.

"Well Cuttings" Found

Hidden found potash minerals "well cuttings" in the area. This pioneering work was completed by the United States Geological Survey.
