Which Animals Live Longest?

It was announced recently that pony had lived to the amazing age of ffiy-three years. But horses are naturally much longer lived than is generally supposed, for as a rule i horse's legs go from unnatural work on hard roads and it is destroyed long before it has reached its natural span

The longest lived of British mammals is probably the red deer. Forty, fifty, even sixty years is given as the ge of this animal. The famous white hind of Loch Treig is said to have lived one hundred and ten years. Elephants usually live to eighty

and there are many instances of elephants over a hundred years old. But hearts no hatred. size has not much to do with age, for ilons and tigers are not long lived, and even the great grizzly bear, which often weighs twelve hundred pounds has a life span of only thirty years The buffalo is old at twenty."

Birds live longer than beasts. The parrot holds the record in this respect. There is a parrot in London which is definitely known to be at least one hundred and twenty years old. All day it talks, swings on a rope, and plays with a ball. This bird was originally the tribal mascot of the Rajah of Satura, and was captured rouge to her knee. from him in 1801. Ravens and eagles are supposed to live a very long time. but we have no exact figures. Of geese, however, we have an instance of one sixty years old that was still strong and healthy.

The tortoise is the longest lived of land animals. One of the giant Galapagos Island tortoises which died in the Zoo in 1906 was believed to be three hundred and fifty years old.

#### Burbank's Garden

"Cut up for building lots." This is the fate threatening more than two of the three acres of Luther Burbank's "Garden of Enchantment" in Santa Rosa, where he cherished the best of the products of his lifelong adventures in plant breeding. Fortunately, the experimental farm of 600 acres at Sebastopol is intact, for the present at last, and the experiments which he was carrying on when he died will be continued. But even this has an uncertain tenure. Leland Stanford University had hoped to take 280 pounds, of which the United States possession of the two tracts as a living memorial to the master gardener. But the funds have not been raised. In the meantime the genius and the lelicate hands of Luther Burbank are gone. His assistants are going on ed. We n America have not yet come to realize that in few products of human endeavor has age such value as in garlens. When, in addition to the qualiies of permanence which are inherent in garden plots that have been tended for long years, the creator had th skill and aftistry of Burbank, it seems little short of sacrilege to destroy the beauty that he created because the land is needed for commercial purposes.

A small portion of the Santa Rose garden will be kept by Mrs. Burbank and probably will be ultimately turnd over to the town as a public park: But the shade of the master, as it aunts the cedars of Lebanon under which he is buried in his garden, must b reminded of the ingratifude of a people to whose State Burbank helped to bring deserved fame. What will future visitors say when they learn that California was too poor to save two acres of garden which had become famous throughout the world?

n One Hour 450 Pounds Was Melted in Furnace-

London-A remarkable new proess by which steel is made by wireless was demonstrated at the Sheffleld works of Edgar Allen & Co., Ltd. Four hundred and fifty pounds of teel were metleed in an hour by means of a high-frequency electrical urrent which was projected into the furnace. The current induced heat sufficient to melt the metal.

The electrical effects were similar o those used in wireless installations. he walls of the crucible served as a container; no heat passed through, and the wooden box containing the urnace was so cool that the hand uld be placed on it.
