

Chinese Women "Bob" At Risk of Death or Fines

Shooting of Girls as Reds Recalls Laws Based on View That Shorn Locks Imperil Masculine Rule

Death by torture is not so popular in China as it used to be. Medieval forms of punishment have not been entirely abandoned in the interior, but along the coast, they are gradually giving way to the more modern way of shooting people down in the streets. The shooting process, practiced by the Nationalist troops, makes no exception in favor of girls and women. It is in fact particularly directed at women with bobbed hair.

"At least," reports an Associated Press dispatch from Canton, "have been shot down by anti-red troops, bobbed hair is considered to be the sign of a female Communist in China." Setting aside the questionable assumption that every Chinese woman who has bobbed hair must necessarily be a Communist is interesting in connection with the relation of bobbed hair to murder in the streets.

Shooting women has a long record of official atrocity behind it. Officials strained their imaginations to invent foul tortures. Flogging was, and still is, a punishment inflicted in a public place where the public may be warned of the consequences of crime. The flogging is performed with bamboo, catan or whip. Its severity is measured by the number of blows ordered by a magistrate, and death may ensue.

Executioner Adjunct of Army of all forms of death a Chinese most abhors the execution because it suggests that he will appear in the spirit world headless. He has seen in China clearly evidence of the practice of beheading persons in the streets. A beheading squad is no uncommon sight. It is a necessary adjunct to an army and the execution of its men is an honor which the soldier is proud to perform.

Bobbing Forbidden by Law. Masculine indignation against women bobbing their hair was aroused long before Communism began commencing trouble in China. Both North and South China have officially prohibited bobbing. The action of the Canton municipal Legislature is typical of the underlying tendencies of Chinese men. The gray-headed wise men of the Legislature advised one day to take vigorous action against the menace of women. The wise men of the Far East believe that bobbed hair is a woman's abomination and that in some mysterious fashion the woman who has her hair bobbed, forthwith endowed with the intellectual prowess of men, a thing not to be tolerated. It is the right of manhood which will yet be maintained.

What," asked these Chinese gentlemen, "is to become of us, if these Western women go on bobbing their hair? What is to become of the sacred rights of men?" It is moved, and seconded and passed, the decision, "that a law be framed prohibiting the bobbing of hair by women in the province of Canton." And so in the province of Kwantung, the province from which Nationalist troops are now taking the form at law, so far as the women of Tientsin and Beijing are concerned.

February 12. Lesson VII—Jesus Pictures the Kingdom of God, Mark 4: 26-34. Golden Text—Thy Kingdom, as it is in heaven.—Matt. 6: 10.

ANALYSIS.
I. THE CERTAINTY OF THE COMING OF THE KINGDOM. 26-29.
II. THE VAST SIGNIFICANCE OF PRESENT BEGINNINGS. 30-34.

INTRODUCTION.—How are we to understand the phrase "Kingdom of God," which was so often on the lips of Jesus, and which, as we have seen, is the central theme of his teaching? In his Jewish people, as you know, looked forward to a coming age when God would institute his righteous reign on earth; indeed, all their hopes of God, all their thoughts of religion were bound up with the realization of this dream. Nevertheless, they conceived this reign of God for a most part after a very worldly and materialistic fashion. They signified, then the overthrow of their enemies, and the triumph of the chosen nation over the peoples of the world.

Now Jesus, while sharing with his people the hope of the Kingdom of God as the goal of his history, gave it an entirely other character. He did not mean the coming of a political Israel, but the coming of a kingdom which would be the condition of human faith and repentance. The dark clouds which came over the eyes of men and the face of the Father in heaven did not obscure Jesus. He had seen the heavens opened, and knew that blessed life of communion with himself which God desired for all men. In all his teaching he sought to make men partakers of the same kingdom.

So, in speaking of the kingdom, Jesus emphasized, first of all, the realization which comes when the Kingdom of God comes in the heart, and that it is the part of his believing followers. They were not to be discouraged by present opposition or by present calamity. God will reward him who will not be discouraged by present opposition or by present calamity. He only knows that, as he sows, so shall he reap.

Claim for Seizure of Ship titled After 115 Years

The United States Pa... \$23,644.38 on Original or 125 Heirs

An international claim over a period of 115 years, amounting to \$23,644.38, terminated. The United States government had paid \$23,644.38 to the Canadian government for a claim among 125 heirs of the schooner Lord Nelson, the property of James and William Crooks, to thirteen days before the 1912 officially began. The settlement was made by the International Tribunal at Geneva, Switzerland.

Along the Niagara frontier had been in the hands of the British since 1812 and had not been returned to the British government of Canada until 1912. The schooner Lord Nelson, a cargo of lumber for the steamship company, was seized by the United States in 1807. The court eventually established the illegality of the seizure.
