Radio Equipped Hotel Tell Will

Coolidge Most Popular Radio Spen —Only 124 Out of 221

Pario taste of the traveling public for varies greatly according to statistics so gathered since March. 1925, among the guests in the Robert Morals Hetel in Philadelphia, the rooms of which are radio equipped.

The method of securing this opinion is by placing a card in each room, to be filled out by the guest and cr which preference may be expressed for any particular style of entertains ment. This was done in order to make sure that the best selection from the various radio programs was being sent into the guest rooms. Out of 2,210 cards which expressed a preference it was found that 1,952 persons (or nearly 90 per cent.) preferred music. Of the various types of music the vocal selections were the most popular, and the most popular single vocal feature was the Atwater Kent concert on Sunday evening. Following vocal selections in bepularity were the orchestral features in which the Gypsy String Ensemble and the Silvertown Orchestra led. Opera, symphony and classical music generally were third in the list, and lazz: music proved to be the least enjoyable to patrons in the hotel. Only 239 out of 1,952 persons who preferred music enjoyed jazz, and almost as many people expressed a decided dis ike to hearing jazz as there were those who preferred it. One hundred and twenty-four out of 2,210 enjoyed sormons and church music best of all and 241 expressed a proference for the special features.
