**Bat Caves of Haiti Yield Strange Bones**

Remnants of Animals and Birds Now Extinct Brought Back by Smithsonian Expedition

How rapidly races of animals may die out is illustrated by a large collection of extinct animal bones gathered in the limestone caves of Haiti and brought back to this country by the Smithsonian expedition under Arthur H. Peole of the National Museum.

The caves, which are near the western edge of the great central plain of Haiti near San Michel, are interesting for the bones are six or seven feet deep in guano and refuse. Scattered through this guano the Smithsonian expedition found quantities of animal and bird bones, many of them representative of species which no longer inhabit the island, though the period of their deposit probably does not extend back more than 2,000 years and many bones are of recent origin.
