### How Much Water Should Baby Get?

### Germany Builds New Ports for Air Traffic

Berlin.—The month of March saw 1,430 airplanes start from or land at the great Tempelhof airport in Berlin, carrying 3,233 passengers and almost thirty-four tons of baggage, freight and post. Air travel is increasing steadily from all German stations, compelling everywhere a corresponding enlargement of existing ports and the creation of new ones. The present landing place on the Oberweserfeld in the northwestern part of Munich, comprising about 200 acres, is being transformed into a modern airport. Air traffic in Silesia is also making great strides, and the coming-summer will see eight lines in operation.

Announcements of participation in the "Jia," the great international air traffic exposition to be held in Berlin from October 7 to 23, have been received from 30 many countries, including the United States, and the two great auto halls on the exposition grounds will not be large enough to contain all the exhibits, and it will be necessary to use a third great hall which is now being built. The exposition will be by far the greatest of its kind ever held.

### Death Rate for Peers At High Level in 1927

The year 1927 was a fatal one for more British peers and peeresses than in any year since 1878. Thirty-seven peers died and thirty-one peeresses. The new Debit for 1928, in recording the high death rate among the peers, states that forty-three baronesses have been called out of abeyance since 1904. The title which remained longest in abeyance, 547 years, was that of the barony of Strabrig, the heir to Parliament was J. M. Kenworthy, member of the barony of Boreas, thirty-seven days. The average for the whole peerage in one title called out in not quite every eight years.

During 1927 upward of 400 honors were bestowed and seven new peerages were created. It takes 3,360 closely packed pages to list Great Britain's various ranks of titled folk with their dignities and honors.



### Youth Win Prize

Arthur Cleland Lloyd, nineteen-year-old Vancouver youth, who won the prize of \$1,000 offered by E. W. Healy, Chairman and President of the Canadian Pacific Railway, for orchestral suite open to all comers. This prize is given in connection with the Quebec Folk Song and Handicrafts Festival which is to be held in Quebec, May 24-28.

Mr. Lloyd has been under the tutelage of Percy Grainger in Chicago, and is at the present time studying under Harold Bauer and Nicolai Medvedoff in New York. He won the distinction of Associate of Toronto Conservatory of Music with full honors while at the age of thirteen.

### League to Get Report On Unrest in Samoa

Auckland, New Zealand.—Sir George Richardson, former administrator of Western Samoa for the New Zealand Government under its mandate for the League of Nations, has arrived here to confer with the government before proceeding to Geneva to appear before the mandates committee. Sir George, who was administrator of Samoa for five years, will give evidence to the committee, as representative of New Zealand, about the recent conditions of unrest there. These conditions led the government to send two cruisers to the island with the result that 400 natives were arrested and several Europeans alleged to have been their leaders were expelled.

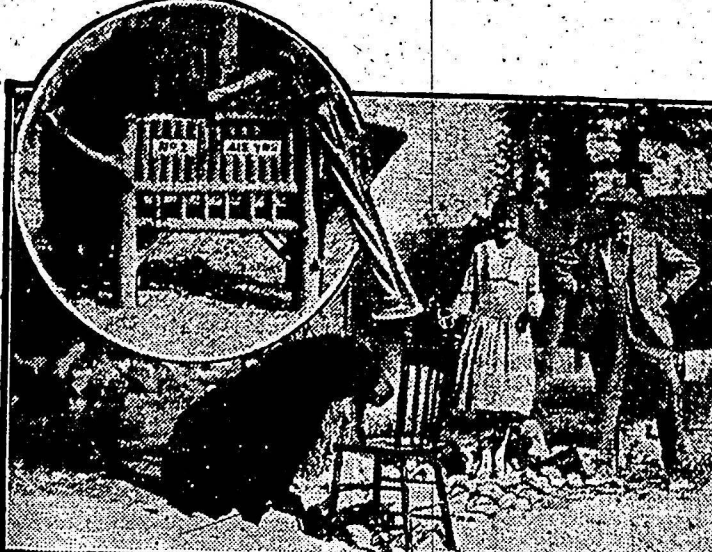

### English Police Get Glowing Tributes

With Only a Shred of Evidence, Two Malefactors Are Brought to Justice

London.—Remarkable tributes to English police efficiency and the speedy detection and apprehension of criminals was paid by the press, following Mr. Justice Avory's sentencing the two slayers of Constable Gutteridge, who was shot down in the performance of his duty. The crime was committed by motor-car thieves in the darkness of a lonely country road on Sept. 27.

No one was arrested for many months. Scotland Yard, with only a shred of evidence to guide them, arrested the suspects on Jan. 20, and, step by step, built up a conclusive case. The jury quickly found them both guilty after a five-day trial and the court imposed the extreme penalty, thus ending what The Times leader characterizes as "the most remarkable trial for murder in recent years."

In no case within living memory have the police shown more ability in the detection and capture of apparently inescapable criminals. Convicts obtained at a long interval after a crime has been committed are of special value for the protection of society. They bring home to the most undesirable criminals that the arm of the law is long and that escape from arrest and from confinement for many months cannot free them from the haunting dread that retribution will reach them in the end.

### Poincare Looks to U.S. For New Wine Market

Premier Raymond Poincare, reported to be resolutely dry, usually drinks water, is nevertheless a devotee of the prosperity of French wine industry and does not despair of America changing her respect to prohibition.

"All countries have the right to isolate as they see fit," he told an audience in the southern French village, "but it isn't forbidden to that some day even America will have its truth in the saying: 'Anglo-Saxon poet and philosopher: 'I am health; I am I am life' which he quoted in English."

Endless green stalks, thick as pencils, rise to the height of a man's waist. Clover leaves make a forest of light green under the nodding white cylinders of the clover blossoms. Tiny flies comprise these cylinders of white sweetness, whose buzz has a delicious taint. Not a cloying overpowering scent, but a mild, pleasant fragrance.

The lawns they white clovers, close to the ground, are curving to form diminutive, daisy-like heads, perfume the atmosphere. When they are not full-grown, green tips the petals—petals almost like tiny chrysanthemums; when in full bloom, the petals are the very surface of summer. When dry and powdery, a coppery brown tint changes the fluttering petals, but a faint scent above the dryness still is easily recognizable.

Marion shades claim the larger red clover that covers the field which follows. On the windy, sweet clover scents come flying, even far away from the field one can picture the purple-colored clover blossoms; their pointed oval green leaves that have deep central veins, their plant light green stalks. In the wind the blossoms bend; the under surface of light-green spreads as it follows the wind's course, hiding its soft red blossoms under its obscurity to the summer breeze.
