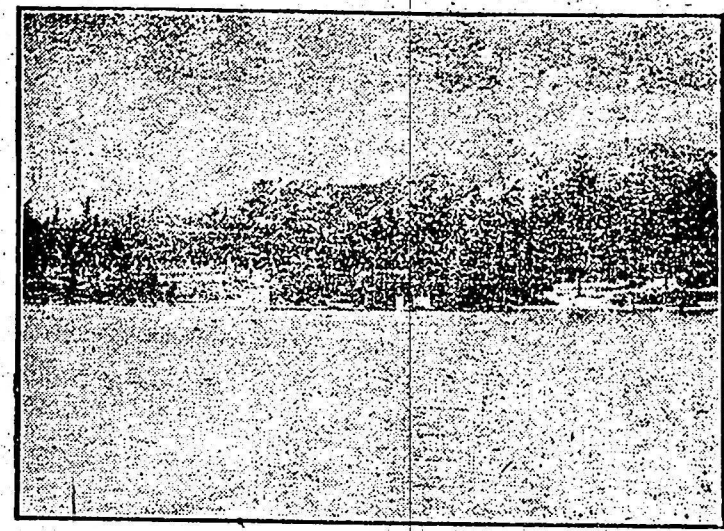
"A damned sneak-thief would collect nothing," snarled Vantine. Yet he paused.

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Turn to Law Making

Turkey's Emancipated Women Begin to Take Up Politics

Prospects for participation by Turkish women in politics are fairly bright. In the opinion of Ailwin Wellmann, a German Socialist recently returned from a sojourn in the Turkish Republic, as expected in a German feminist paper:

"One cannot talk about a Socialist movement, let alone a women's Socialist movement, in Turkey. Among women the beginnings of a general political movement are stirring. It is being directed chiefly by educated women."

The great advance which the President of the Turkish Republic, Kemal Pasha, has brought to Turkish women is the liberation from external subjection. Polygamy is prohibited and the veil has fallen. A woman, like a man, may go about freely and devote her interests to public matters. In the provinces, as old traditions are still very strong, while on the other hand the women of Ankara, the present seat of government, and Constantinople have emancipated themselves with astonishing rapidity.

"Kemal Pasha, thus far, has been the great reformer of customs. Women have already on several occasions sent deputations to him with a request for the political franchise. During the preparations for the elections last summer, the workers for the first time put forward two of their colleagues from the factory. I learned, upon my departure, that they were still awaiting endorsement by Kemal Pasha."

In Turkey, too, as a result of the shifting in world economy, the labor question will become more and more pressing. With the advance of the working class, women also will obtain more freedom. To judge from the progress of Turkey within recent times, the date of this certainty should not be far off."

Viscount Cecil on Security

"At Locarno we gave an absolute guarantee to defend both France and Germany against aggression by the other. Now did we get any disarming in exchange? Obviously we cannot extend that policy any further," writes Viscount Cecil in the Sunday Times.

"But what about collective guarantees? Are they really so unworkable as some say? Why should we not be ready to take our share and not more than our share of a general European guarantee against aggression in return for a substantial measure of disarming? After all, would such an undertaking make much difference in our actual liabilities?"

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Prize Diamonds are Found in Namaqualand

No Digging Necessary to Get Orange River Stones, Worth about \$2,500,000

Cape Town—Diamonds more beautiful than anything the world has seen will be sent to the cutters in Europe when the official ban on the new areas in Namaqualand is removed.

These rich patches of gravel near the mouth of the Orange River recently have yielded stones worth nearly \$2,500,000, and the surface has been only scratched. A Cabinet minister recently spent an hour picking up stones on a claim. There was no laborious digging or washing. He collected everything that looked like a diamond, and when his finds were sorted their value was estimated at \$30,000.

CLAIMS CAREFULLY GUARDED

In size, purity and quality the Namaqualand stones compare favorably with the historic finds of the past. Very few people have been allowed to see them. The claims at the mouth of the Orange River are being guarded, but the territory is so large that it has been impossible to prevent raids.

The raiders make swift motor-driven dashes from the alluvial diggings in the Transvaal across the lonely veld to Namaqualand. They seem to know exactly where to search, and they rush their finds back to their own claims, where they are able to "disguise" and register them without danger of being caught.

It is strange that these new diamond fields, containing the richest board in the world, should have escaped the shovels of prospectors for so many years.

The late Fred C. Cornell, author and prospector who leaves the mysterious territory south of the Orange River better than any other explorer of his time, followed the legendary gleam of diamonds in the desert sand for years without success. In his books and articles he predicted that vast quantities of diamonds, washed down toward the mouth of the Orange River by inland diamond pits, would one day be discovered. And now, after his death, the stories which the primitive Hotentots of the Richtersveld told him have at last come true.

STONES TINGED WITH BLUE

Diamonds also have been found on the islands off the coast to the north of the Orange River. Many scientists believe that all the coast diamonds originate in a "parent rock" on the bed of the ocean and that they work their way through submarine pipes into the gravel of the seashore.


Among the Namaqualand finds are some colored stones. One is a particularly fine blue diamond, and is undoubtedly Hope diamond, and probably is worth thousands of pounds. Many of the stones are of exquisite quality that they have the appearance of cut diamonds, though they have not been touched by any instrument.

Driving Hints

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
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
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
