Essay Competition

On Friday afternoon a pleasant ceremony in connection with Empire Day took place at the Markdale Public School on the occasion of the visit of the Mariné Chapter of the Daughters of the Empire. They recently sponsored an essay competition in Form IV, the candidates selecting either of these two topics upon which to write "The British Empire" or "Canada's Relationship to the Mother Country." The object was to present to the city a large framed picture in colors of King John signing the Great Charter at Runnymede on the River Thames in 1215. The winning essayist, Miss Mildred Callis, will have her name engraved on a silver shield to be mounted on the frame below the picture.

Mrs. L. G. Campbell, Regent of the local Chapter of the I.O.D.E., outlined the work in connection with the contest, the judging of the essays and the interest of the society in the welfare of the boys and girls in the public schools and then in a very suitable manner presented the picture. Principal W. J. Messenger in accepting the picture on behalf of Form IV of the Public School commended the Daughters of the Empire for their interest in the school and in providing an incentive to special endeavour such as they had done and mentioned that such contests are of inestimable value to the pupils.

Mrs. Gordon Beaton in an interesting manner explained in detail the historical events leading up to the passing of the Great Charter and its bearing on our life even yet and concluded with a study of the picture in detail.

The pupils of Form IV provided a varied program of literary and musical numbers, practically all of which were on the subject of the British Empire. After the winning essay had been read by its author and the second prize one by its writer, Miss Mildred Lee, it was easy to understand that the contest had been a complete success and that all its participants would benefit by having a broader knowledge of the British Empire.
