Coast-to-Coast Trip Shows Air Mail On the Job

Correspondent Sees For Himself How Planes Cut 3000 Miles to 31 Hours

The air mail has shortened the 3,000 miles between New York, City and San Francisco to 21 hours. Mail posted in Wall Street on Monday morning is delivered in Market Street late Tuesday afternoon.

By a Staff Correspondent New York—Air Mailers, who scurried to their posts in the National Air Transport hangar at Hialeah Field, N.J., the chief air mail terminal of the East, an airplane and dropped it on the tarmac with a perfect three-point landing.

Two men ran out and led it to its mooring. The others moved the mail from its hold and rushed it to a station where clerks sorted it rapidly. Meanwhile a mechanic was waiting for the airplane that would soon leave for the West on the first lap of a flight across the continent.

San Francisco at that moment was 3,000 miles away—the same distance toward which the Pony Express flew less than three centuries of a century ago. Hard-riding messengers, riding over short relays, spanned the miles from the end of the Golden Gate, St. Joseph, Mo., to the Missouri river, they rode it in eight days.

Coast to Coast From coast to coast, over 3,000 miles in this distance, a letter is delivered in 21 hours. To send a letter by air has become a habit of mind at the corner grocery, and it is now being carried over the continent in less than a score of air miles.

The ship flew so smoothly and the motor droned so soothingly that I fell asleep. When I awoke we were circling down to the revolving beacon on the emergency field at Rock Falls, Ill. For ahead forced us to make ourselves at home in a cold little shack until morning.

Then we were off again for Iowa City and Omaha, where mail and baggage were transferred to another plane and I met my new pilot, E. M. Allison, introduced as one of Boeing's "star" men.

We set out within 10 minutes and headed a heavy wind to reach North Platte at 3:40 o'clock that afternoon. The farms were laid out in neat 160-acre squares, with fences running directly east and west, north and south, which is of great assistance to the pilots. Two hours later the bright, painted roofs of Cheyenne welcomed us.

Through to Rock Springs Late at night we got through to Rock Springs, Wyo., the halfway point between Cheyenne and Salt Lake. Road lights outlined the field against a jet background.

At that height we could see over all water vapor collectively. The full moon, lighting the trailing mist, transformed them into glowing, baby blankets. Mail pilots see more of the beauty of nature every day than the average city dweller in half a hundred two-week vacations.

Another pilot, Hiking, took the ship. He informed me that the last pilot, Ellis, could "fly" anything, anywhere.

Grand Banks Ice Patrol Is Reviewed by Comm. Gabbett

Coast Guard Cutter Mojave Arrives at Halifax; Daily Broadcast Is Made

Halifax, N.S.—The work of the international ice patrol this season was reviewed by Commander Cecil M. Gabbett, of the United States Coast Guard cutter Mojave, when the vessel put in here after its second tour of duty on the Grand Banks. It was the first time that the Mojave, which alternates on patrol with the cutter Modoc at fortnightly intervals, had called here.

The Mojave, like the Modoc, is electrically driven and is one of the few vessels of that type afloat. The ship is equipped with every modern aid to navigation, including a fathometer which tells the depth of water under the vessel by means of sound waves.
