Elko, Nev .-- Diatomaccous earth from Carlin, Elko County, is finding its way to Cape Town. South. Africa, where it is reground and used for polishing diamonds. The diatomaceous earth is used to take off the haze that is left on the diamond before polishing, and the Carlin product has been found quite effective.

Through British companies the Carlin plant has received inquiries from New Zealand, Africa and Germany concerning its product. The plant, however, depends largely on the American market. 
