## WORLD NEWS IN BRIEF

### CANADIAN

Eleven fatalities at level crossings occurred in the Dominion at the weekend.

Lord Willingdon will open the Canadian National Exhibition, Toronto, on Friday, August 24th.

Hon. R. B. Bennett's tour of Canada is being continued to the Maritime Provinces, where he will spend a month.

By the purchase of the Standard Bank by the Bank of Commerce the number of banks in Canada is reduced to twelve.

Seventy-eight men were arrested on gambling charges at the Prospectors' Club, 527A Bloor St. West, Toronto, on July 24th.

Nineteen were confirmed in the Anglican Church at Durham last week, twenty-eight at Dundalk.

Moses Jackson, a former Reeve of Bentinck, and a life-long resident of the town, died on July 19th.

J. L. Sedman, for many years foreman in the Chronicle office at Durham, has gone to Simeon, where he has accepted a position.

Three thousand masons and their families attended a picnic of the Georgian District at Wasaga Beach on Wednesday of last week.

Harvey Voslin of Durham got a piece of steel in his eye at the Stone and Sand plant and was taken to Hamilton hospital to have it removed.

The C.N.R. freight sheds at Hanover were destroyed by fire one night last week. A large quantity of furniture ready for shipment was destroyed in the fire.

A sentence of seven years in the penitentiary was pronounced by a New Brunswick judge last week on a hit-and-run motorist whose victim died from injuries.

The Ontario Department of Health directed by Hon. Dr. Forbes Godfrey, is planning for free distribution of the watery extract of liver, as a cure for pernicious anaemia.

Mr. M. E. Hurst, head of the geological party working in Favourable Lake area, at the extreme northwest corner of Ontario, reports a new find of galena, 18 miles from the Connell option. Gold, silver, lead and zinc have all been found in this area.

Rt. Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, Hon. C. A. Dunning and Senator Danierand will represent Canada at the League of Nations Assembly this year. They will leave for Geneva at the end of August. During August Premier King will tour the Western Provinces.

The Farmers' Sun notes that the membership of the Saskatchewan Live Stock Pool is growing rapidly, now totalling 10,216, with estimated marketing of 55,366 cattle, 109,146 hogs, and 15,177 sheep, about 33 per cent of the annual marketable live stock of the Province.

The first year's operation of the Ontario Wheat Pool has just been closed. The results are announced as satisfactory. It is also announced that arrangements are now being made for the handling of the 1928 crop throughout the territory in which the pool has been organized.

Dr. J. B. Reynolds, retiring President of the O.A.C., Guelph, was presented by the staff with a cabinet of silver, and by R. J. Rogers, Agricultural Representative for York, representing York county, with a gold watch. It was announced that the graduating class of '28 will present to the College a portrait of Dr. Reynolds.

Joe Wright, winner of the Diamond Sculls at the recent rowing tournament at Henley, England, and Jack Guest who also made a good record at Henley, have been entered for the Olympic races at Amsterdam, to take place early in August, with representative scullers from all over the world. Both young men live in Toronto.

A delegation of Ontario drivers waited on Hon. J. S. Martin, Minister of Agriculture, and Hon. Geo. S. Henry, Acting Prime Minister, at the Provincial Parliament Buildings in Toronto on July 24th, to condemn the Dominion hog-grading regulations, which, they asserted, have caused nothing but confusion for farmers and shippers. They asked that the grading be confined to the abattoirs and stock-yards, instead of being done at local points.

Russia's Soviet Government has planned for a great Volga-Dos Canal connecting the Black sea in the south with the White sea in the north. The river-canal system, when completed, will open an easy way for Russian timber and wheat to the world's markets via the Black Sea, and will serve a population in Eastern Russia of 45,000,000 people. The Government is prepared to spend \$3,000,000 on its construction.

### THE MARKDALE STANDARD

Official announcement has been made of the opening of a Japanese Legation at Ottawa, with a resident Minister from Japan.

#### BRITISH AND FOREIGN

The Archdiocese of Canterbury has been offered to the Most Rev. Cosmo Gordon Lang, Archbishop of York. Archbishop Davidson's retirement because of advanced age.

Ramsay Macdonald has been returned unopposed to the Chairmanship of the Labor Party in Great Britain, for the final session of the Parliament, beginning in November.

The Government of Hungary has decreed that all the Hungarian gipsies, 30,000 in number, must forsake their nomadic habits and settle down to work like other people. They must also abandon the picturesque dress costume.

It has been announced that the dormer works, Berlin, are constructing eight huge passenger planes, each with 12 motors for air service between Germany and Florida. They will be known as Dornier Du-X, and the transoceanic service will begin next year.

A series of conferences began in India on July 25th between representatives of reigning Princes of Native Indian States and the British Secretary of State for India, the Earl of Birkenhead. The Princes seek the Federation of all India, with an independent status, for each state.

On July 24th, in defiance of King George's edict suspending the Egyptian Houses of Parliament for three years, 170 Senators and Deputies who are followers of Zaghlul Pasha, declared their intention to assemble on July 28th. The Wafd party on July 22 published a manifesto denouncing the Government as playing into the hands of Great Britain.

Ellen Terry, the world famous actress who played with Sir Henry Irving, died at her home in Kent, England, on July 22nd, at the age of 86. Her funeral, by her own wish, was attended by none of the traplings of mourning. After cremation of her body the ashes were deposited in St. Paul's Church, Covent Garden, the actors' church for 260 years.

Following this up I offered myself as a worker among the Red-men. Under circumstances drove me to Fisher River as a school teacher. I was here one year—and again toward circumstances drove me away. Then my health was thought to be so bad that I could not go North, so I was sent here again as a teacher for another year. During these two years I got a good hold on the language.

Then in 1896 I went to Oxford House in the Far North. Here I had a mission about 500 miles square, and in it God's Lake, Island Lake, etc., etc. Here I stayed over four years. Then circumstances without my control took me for five years in the white work and then in 1907 I came to Fisher River and am thus just at the end of 21 years of steady work. In all I have spent 23 years here. The last nine years I have been alone as my wife and family are all away.

From 1913 to 1920 I made long missionary trips by canoe or dog train, visiting isolated bands of Indians. I have of course, a complete command of the Indian language and know their modes of life and mind thoroughly well.

Our mission plan is pretty well set on my better work. The church and house are comfortable and well kept as are also the grounds, etc. We have on Sundays morning service in Cree Indian. Evening service is in English and both are well attended. Our Sunday School is very encouraging.

Our day school has two fine class rooms and five-roomed teachers residence combined. It has a complete cement basement, furnace, etc. There is an average of 75 in attendance, and the whole is as good as could be had.

A very great deal of my work is that of doctoring the people. I have a nice dispensary and a good stock of drugs and years of experience so I can do a pretty good job of helping in sickness. I came into this special work because I thought that God called me. So far as I have gone I have felt that I was doing His will and I propose to keep on till He says "Enough."
