Accident at Berkeley Results in Death of John Dixon Angus

Laid to Rest in Greenwood Cemetery

A sad and tragic accident occurred near Berkeley on Thursday, September 6th, when John Dixon Angus, thirteen year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Angus, was fatally injured. He was returning from school at S.S. No. 5 and had accepted a ride with a neighbour, Mr. Gladwyn Rowe. When the latter stopped his car the unfortunate boy stepped out, but only to be struck by the corner of the box on a truck belonging to Francis Bakery, and driven by Mr. Gordon Shaw of Owen Sound.

The boy was struck on the back of the head and he also suffered the fracture of several of his ribs. He was picked up in an unconscious condition and Dr. Phillips of Chateaufort, who happened along a short time after the accident occurred, put the lad in his car and rushed him to Owen Sound Hospital. Further examination there revealed the fact that the skull had been fractured, and, although everything possible was done, he failed to regain consciousness and passed away at two o'clock on Friday morning.

Jack was a regular attendant of the United Church Sunday School and was a general favorite of all. The funeral was held on Sunday, September 9th, at 2 p.m., from the residence of his parents. A most impressive and consoling message was given by Rev. Mr. W. G. Wakefield, assisted by Rev. Mr. McCarten. Three favorite hymns of the Sunday School were sung. It was one of the largest funerals seen in this community for some time, the procession numbering nearly 100 cars, motored to Owen Sound where interment was held in Greenwood Cemetery.

Desides his grief stricken parents he leaves to mourn his loss two sisters, Maybell and Isabell Angus, Miss Angus is 12 years old. The pallbearers were school mates of the deceased, namely: Clarence Wilson, Wesley Kirk, Gladwyn Rowe, Bill Hockley, Stanley Steward, William Steward.

Mr. Henry D. McLoughry passed away Monday evening, September 10th, at his home on the East Backline, Artemesia, aged 63 years. He had been in failing health for some months and the end was not unexpected.

The late Mr. McLoughry was born in the township and had spent most of his life close to where he died. He was a man of sterling qualities and was held in high esteem by all. For a great number of years, he had been an active member of Annesley Church. He was also a member of the Orange Order and a Past Master of Artemesia District.
