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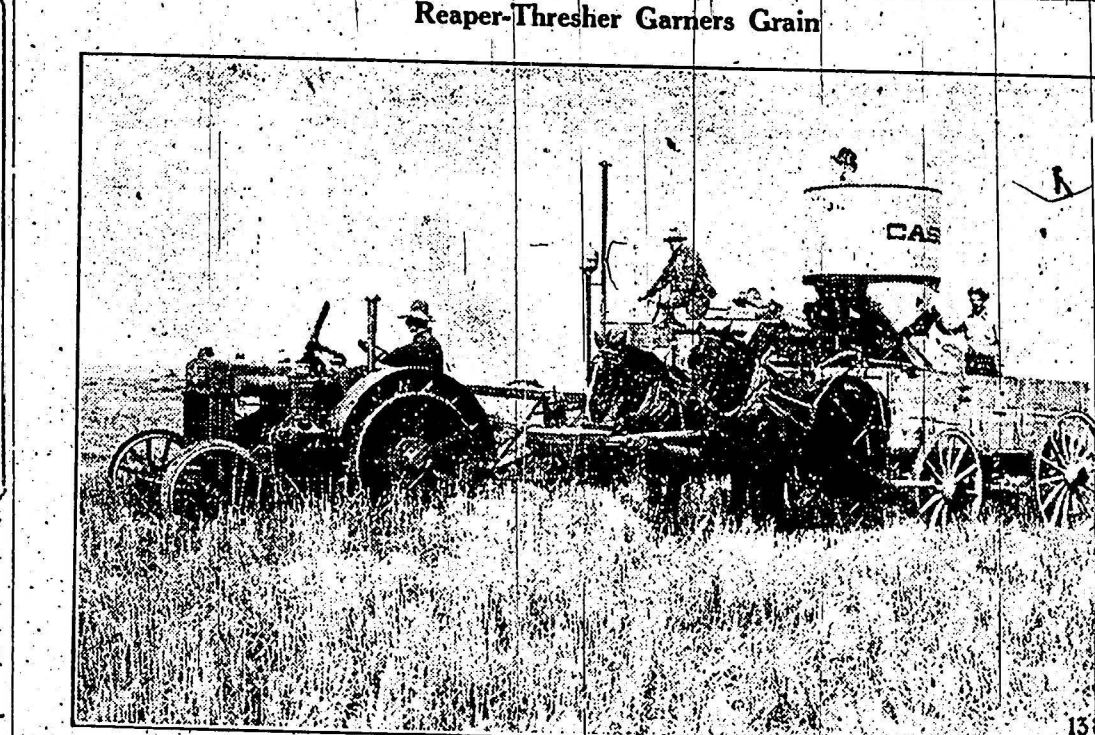

Portugal Tries 'Keep to Right' Amid Confusion

Sudden Reversal of Old Traffic Custom Gives Officials Busy Period

Beasts Resist Change

Huge Banners Proclaim Altered Rule of Travel

There has been a drastic change made in one of the long-standing customs of the people of Portugal, writes the Lisbon correspondent of "The Christian Science Monitor."

Up to the present England and Portugal were almost the only European countries whose rule of the road was to the left.

Now a new decision has been taken, chiefly for the convenience of tourists motoring to enable them to continue to follow the rules adopted in the neighboring countries, France and Spain, and now the passport throughout all Portugal is "Keep to the right."

At the time of the change Lisbon presented an unusual appearance during the night many hundreds of banners with these words printed in huge black letters had been swung up in every available place, and all traffic, which commenced at 5 a. m., was running in a contrary direction.

During the night in Lisbon and Oporto the electric company men worked hard at changing the points. As this was too great a task for one night, the day was marked by a number of demonstrations, one of them at reduced speed.

The morning witnessed scenes of great confusion, especially at the hour when people were going to business, as no one knew exactly where to take his train or even how to board it owing to the necessary change of hand in stepping the rail.

Fun at Street-Corner

According to a statement made by the engineer of the electric train company, the expense incurred by changing all the points amounts to 700,000 escudos (about \$30,000).

Great help was afforded the authorities by the Lisbon branch of the American Vacuum Oil Co., who, with the cooperation of "Dario Notteles," offered to make hundreds of huge banners indicating the new orders, have them hung and affixed in all the towns and all the main roads of Portugal, sharing the expense between them.

The Portuguese always are ready to get a bit of fun out of anything that turns up, and so in Lisbon groups of face-painted soldiers gathered from the first hours of the morning around the principal stopping places, bearing signs of white canvas on their breasts and inscribed with the words "To the Right" and "Keep to the Right."

These greeted motorists with clapping and laughter. The police, whose service was excellent, allowed these social people to amuse themselves, as their humor had at the same time the good effect of reminding people and vehicles of the new order of things.

Four-Footed Resistance

The chief effects were felt at the town offices and banks, where all the staff arrived about an hour later than usual, and in the markets, where everything was in confusion. For although the two-legged population docilely obeyed superior orders, there was an obstinate four-footed resistance to be faced. Horses, mules, donkeys and oxen, bearing their daily supplies of vegetables, fruit, flowers and other marketable articles to the markets, having got into a habit of years to keep to the left, proved as obstinate to their drivers' efforts to lead them to the right as they were to the orders of the printed banners and of the police. Fines were showered on the unfortunate drivers and women with their donkeys, and the markets rang with profuse vituperation and lamentations when, very late in the day, the country people, their beasts and their waves tardily arrived there.

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Rescue Device For Submarine Is Full Success

Navy Divers Escape From Bell 160 Feet Below the Surface Proves "Lung"

Further Tests Proposed

Undersea Crew to Leave Ship at Lower Depths

Washington.—The new submarine rescue device, known in the navy as "the lung," is being tested by the means by which crews of imprisoned submarines may be saved in future, according to a report made to the Navy Dept. by Lieut. C. B. Monsen, in charge of tests conducted at depths ranging from 150 to 165 feet in Chesapeake Bay.

The tests were aided by the U.S.S. Falcon, submarine rescue ship which came into prominence at Provincetown, Mass., in the attempted rescue of the crew of the S-4.

"The lung" weighs two pounds and looks like a gas mask. Lieut. Monsen's report explains that men were sent down in a bell to the depths mentioned. He adds:

Diving Bell Bears Men

The bell was lowered three times with two men in each time. One man was to effect escape, while the other's duty was to remain in the bell, to telephone and to return to the surface inside the bell. The three men were Lieut. Monsen, Chief Torpedoman Elben and Torpedoman First Class Kalanowski.

The time of rise was 8 minutes and 35 seconds, a minutes 35 seconds and 4 minutes 15 seconds. Each man ascended rather in the deep, to a depth of the fifty-foot depth, where the line was marked with a wooden ball. The line, with a buoy attached to it, had been previously passed out to the surface, giving the men something on which to slide on their ascent.

The stops at the fifty-foot depth, the twenty-foot and ten-foot intervals were timed by counting the number of breaths.

Life Line Guides to Surface

"All men making their escape had attached to them a life line which the tender on the surface held, so that in case of an accident the men would not be lost. Upon reaching the surface all men were exposed to pressure, and were placed in the decompression tank for safety purposes, so as to insure them against caisson disease. None of the men noticed any discomfort in using the apparatus.

These tests concluded the series of tests which have been conducted for the purpose of proving whether or not the apparatus would function as it was designed—that is, for the purpose of permitting a man to rise from the depths to the surface without injury.

Further tests, to determine whether or not men can flood compartments in submarines and get from the inside of the compartment to the outside of surrounding water, will be conducted at a later time. From the Herald Tribune Washington Bureau.
