Canadian Chrysler Buys Border Land

Windsor—A 76-acre tract of land lying between Ford City and Walkerville has been purchased by the Chrysler Corporation of Canada, who will erect a \$1,500,000 automobile manufacturing plant in the immediate future, the president of the corporation announced today.

In 1924 the present Windsor plant was bought and kept in operation as parts factory. The new plant, when completed, will increase the output of Chrysler to 365 cars a day, an increase of 100 cars a day.

From Royal Bank September Letter

On the whole, Canadians pay proportionately less per unit for imports and receive relatively more for exports than they did in 1914. In recent years the price in the United States of the national debt, the actual profit to Canada during the fiscal year of 1927 amounted to \$168,000,000 million. Imports—An increase in imports from \$619,000,000 in 1914 to \$900,000,000 in 1927 should not be taken to represent a 66 per cent. increase in either value or volume of imports. Since 1914, prices in general have increased about 50 per cent., but the increase in the unit value of imports amounts to only 22 per cent., and the increase in volume of imports to 35 per cent. If it were assumed that 1914 prices had been uniformly increased by 50 per cent., the imports in 1927 would have cost \$1,260 million instead of only \$1,030 million.

The change in prices, then, saved Canada \$230 million on actual imports of 1927, as compared with what had been paid for these same goods had the advance in prices been a uniform rate of 50 per cent. for all commodities.

Exports—In a like manner the crude value of Canadian exports increased 189 per cent. between 1914 and 1927, and the revaluation indicates that the volume of exports has been increased by about 190 per cent., and that the value has increased 35 per cent. per unit. This represents a loss of about 212 per cent. on exports, compared with the amount which would have been obtained had all Canadian exports increased 50 per cent. in value. Canada would then have received \$1,311,000,000 instead of \$1,522,000,000, a total of \$222,000,000, larger than the amount actually obtained.

Balance of Trade—The dollar value of the commodity balance of trade actually achieved in 1927 was a credit to Canada amounting to \$222,000,000. If the imports and exports are revalued on a basis of 1914 prices, Canada's favorable balance would have amounted to only \$24,000,000. The difference, then, between \$222,000,000 and \$24,000,000, or \$198,000,000, represents the net gain in Canada from the changed relationship in world prices. In the twelve months ending in July, 1927, the profit to Canada from the revaluation in price amounted to \$120,000,000.

Gatineau Will Be Dammed Again

Ottawa—The Canadian Hydro-Electric Corp., holding company of the Gatineau Power Co., subsidiary of International Paper Company, has made public details of another great dam to control the waters of the Ottawa River, Quebec. The Bithou Dam, which has been constructed at Baskong, some 200 miles north of Ottawa, and this provides a storage basin estimated to contain 95,000,000 cubic feet of the new dam, which will be of crib construction, will be 80 miles north of the outlet of Cabonga Lake, and will provide a storage basin of about half the size of the other. The Foundation Co. of Montreal has been awarded the contract for the work, and is already engaged in trucking supplies to the site. The dam will be completed next summer.

British to Abate Street Noises

Representatives of Towns Hold Conference with Government at Ministers

London.—The number of street noises has greatly increased in recent years, and all the larger towns were represented last week in a conference with Sir William Jowison-Hicks, Home Secretary, and Colonel Ashley, Minister of Transport, and the heads of both departments, at which steps to abate the nuisance were considered. A Home Office statement said: "The increase in volume of noise is largely due to the increase of motors and of the uses to which motors are put and to the abuse of the various types of horns. The minister has decided that strict regulations directed to abating the nuisance of the motor traffic noise should be prepared. Such regulations will be subject to consultation with the Minister of Transport, and representatives of public organizations whose views will be carefully considered. After the regulations have been made, the police will be advised by the Home Secretary as to the steps to be taken to insure their observance, with a view to decreasing the nuisance from which so many people now suffer."

Interprovincial Law Suit Before Canadian Courts

Question of the Control of Water Powers and Navigations Is Issue

Ottawa.—A legal battle between the Dominion and the provinces on the question of the control of water powers and incidentally navigation has opened in the Supreme Court of Canada before a full bench of seven judges and with an imposing array of eminent counsel representing both sides.

Such matters as the development of the potential powers of the St. Lawrence, both international and inter-provincial in character, the development of water powers in the Ottawa and other power projects are involved, and the issue is probably one of the most important that has come before the courts in years.

Ten questions have been placed before the court for the purpose of obtaining answers to satisfactory elucidate "the whole question of the division of legislative control over the proprietary interest in water power between the Dominion and the provinces."

The Dominion takes the stand that when powers are developed from works which it constructs to aid navigation it owns such surplus powers, which the provinces will contend that water powers were vested in the provinces before Confederation, and were not transferred to Dominion by domain by virtue of the British North American Act, and further, that any treaty respecting an international waterway must be subordinate to the act.

While Ontario and Quebec are chiefly interested in the question and will likely bear the brunt of the battle, British Columbia, Saskatchewan and Manitoba will lend strong support to their side.
