Medical Inspection of School Pupils

Dr. Mackenzie Smith of the Provincial Department of Health has completed his inspection of the pupils in the Markdale Public and High Schools. Dr. Smith is one of the most experienced members of his profession in this work, being the first person to undertake the medical inspection of schools in Ontario outside the cities. Having examined over 150,000 children, she is well qualified for the position and so is quickly able to diagnose each child's condition and to offer advice accordingly. Owing to her very pleasant personality and sympathetic ear, not even the smallest child was reluctant to be examined, but anticipated the event with pleasure. The mother of each child in the Public School was sent word when her child would be examined and was asked to be present if possible. The very hearty response to this request showed the interest manifested in the survey. The examination was very thorough as it included a test of the vision and hearing, heart and lungs, as well as an examination of the nose, throat and teeth and measurements of height and weight, etc. Regular medical inspection is carried out in some of the larger municipalities and in some of the counties of our province and the day is coming when it will be general throughout Ontario. However, these examinations are only beneficial to the extent that parents co-operate and have the doctors given prompt medical or dental treatment, as the case may be. Details of some of the cases examined may handicap the child for life and a child like and adult can only do his best work mentally when he is at his best physically.

The report of the examination of the Markdale Public School children by Dr. Mackenzie Smith is as follows:

111 school and 12 preschool children examined with the following results: A number of physical disabilities were found.

111 children had 210 defects.

111 children had 110 physical disabilities.

The funeral took place on Monday afternoon (Thanksgiving Day), Nov. 12th. The remains were taken to the United Church, where Rev. Mr. Harrower preached a very comforting sermon. Interment took place in Kimberley Cemetery, where Rev. Mr. Harrower also officiated.
