Mr. Turnbull, presented report No. 10 for Road Improvements, amounting to the sum of \$5249.33, which included a progress payment to the Ontario Bridge Co. of \$3755.00, and \$455.12 for approach to McQuarrie's Bridge.

WORLD NEWS IN BRIEF

CANADIAN: With appropriate ceremony Ottawa was opened as an airport recently. Jean Knight, the first Minister from France to Canada, was officially welcomed in Ottawa Nov. 15. Coal has been discovered along the White River, and is being tested at the Mines Laboratories at Ottawa.

The new store to be erected by Eaton's at the corner of College and Yonge St., Toronto, is to have a height of 67 feet above the pavement. Figures made public last week by the Ontario Department of Forestry state that during the present year the Province lost 100,000 acres of forest by fire.

As a result of the new drive by the Ontario Liquor Control Board to enforce provincial regulations, one export liquor dock on the Windsor border has been seized by the Ontario Provincial Police, and other docks are also facing the prospect of being put out of business.

Three of the bandits implicated in the mail car robbery at Toronto in June, Findlay McLeod sr., aged 50, Robert McKibbin, aged 33, and John Brown, alias Sullivan, aged 28, were sentenced to 15 years imprisonment, and Ray Bevan, 24, to 10 years imprisonment.

Rev. E. Stanley Jones, D.D., India, friend of Mahatma Gandhi and Rabindranath Tagore, the Hindu poet, is to speak to mass meetings in Toronto, on Nov. 30, and later in other Canadian cities. He is best known here as author of "The Christ of the Indian Road."

BRITISH AND FOREIGN

Week-end floods in Missouri, Kansas and Oklahoma caused the loss of at least 9 lives, and millions of dollars damage to property. Alfred E. Smith has declared his retirement as an election candidate for the future. Franklin D. Roosevelt is the Governor-elect for New York state. The terrific gale that swept Western Europe at the week-end caused much loss of life as well as much loss of property. In England alone the death toll totalled about 50.

ONE BOX ENDED HIS SUFFERINGS

Serious Bowel Condition Relieved by "Fruit-a-lives". Emperor Hirohito of Japan, in his first speech from the throne, said it was his resolve "to endeavor to promote and cultivate friendly relations with all nations and thus contribute to the maintenance of world peace and advancement of the welfare of humanity."

Prohibition was defeated and the Government forces under Premier Coates suffered a severe setback in the election in New Zealand last week. A new "United Party" made up of Liberals, Nationalists, and Backs opposed to Return on Labor parties, gained gainly seats all over the country.

The recent general election in Australia, which returned Premier Stanley Bruce's Nationalist-Country Coalition Government, but with a decreased majority, went as follows: Nationalists, 615,000; Ind.-Nat., 25,000; Labor, 784,000; Ind.-Lab., 5,000; Country Party, 88,000; Ind.-Country, 4,000; Country-Progressive, 13,000.

An official inquiry has been ordered into the loss of the great steamship "Vestris", which developed a list and sank 240 miles off the coast of Virginia, on a trip between New York and Barbados. Although the highest praise is given to the captain, William J. Carey, and his officers, at the time of the catastrophe, it is asserted that "more efficient methods and greater promptness in summoning aid might have saved the 108 lives lost, including that of the Captain himself, 27 women and 13 children. Survivors told that lifeboats were lowered too slowly; two of them crashing to pieces on their way down to the water; also they say there was too long a delay about abandoning the ship.
