

## The Red Cross and the Home

In Past Five Years Science of Home Nursing Has Been Taught by Red Cross to Over Fifteen Thousand Canadian Women

What we would have done in Canada if our citizens, it is a hundred years ago, had been taught in home nursing, is hard to imagine. A young married woman in a northern Ontario town recently in writing to a friend, "The doctor is so generous with his time and knowledge off his farm that he has no time to go to the big district in which we live. He has no medical man trained to give advice at these great distances. We have no one who can help us in this way in either one of the towns where we live." This is the state of affairs.

But about a year ago, a Red Cross nurse, Mrs. Sibella Barrington, came to this small farming town. She had been invited to do this work this winter. In this case she brought with her a horse and carriage, even more helpful in getting up too much snow. She found the roads fit to walk on some miles in distant snow-covered sections, leading the horse and carrying on precious blocks, but usually got there and back the next morning, and girls, one hundred and fifty, waiting for our instruction." Miss Taylor also records that in the absence of a medical man in her district, the secretary of the municipality frequently asked her to visit this or that sick old lady, to take a look" at some cases of measles or mumps, or to prescribe the right medicine for patients with asthma or other chronic diseases. You see, there is never at any time when there is plenty to do," continued her report. In that year, Miss Taylor organized thirty-five Home Nursing groups, and nearly five hundred women were instructed, not just two more, but more helpers responded to her to meet the demand for nurses, which makes so much for the rest of those who pioneer in Canadian hill-lands.

**Figure of Interesting**  
The figures and facts just issued by the Canadian Red Cross show that the country-wide Home Nursing classes have particular interest. They show that in the last three years nearly a thousand Canadian men and women have graduated from them, and have gone to Europe, to 15,632 women and 21,549 men parts of the continent; that the demand for such training is everywhere far greater than can be met, and that home-makers and teenagers, as well as young girls and young mothers, are exhibiting an eagerness for this education which distinguishes the Red Cross. In the city of Toronto, which has a large number of immigrants, there is a much larger proportion of Red Cross work along this line than any other center. Miss Gosselin, the organizer, reports that in the past four years 246 groups have been headed by her or her assistants, with a total of 4,216 girls and women taking the course. So instant interest has become the demand for Home Nursing instruction that from 50 to 60 new classes are now formed each year with an average of 2,000 girls in attendance. Some of these classes present unique and surprising aspects, for in the last two years groups of the deaf, the dumb, the blind, as well as Chinese or other foreign women speaking no English, have been successfully taught by some of Miss Gosselin's students.

**The Blind and Dumb**  
Achilles at the subjects taught in the Home Nursing course reveals why students soon begin to take this kind of place as the need of very special training for their highly specialized tasks as wives and mothers. The twelve lectures and demonstrations deal with personal and home hygiene, the promotion of health and sickness, signs of illness, care, feeding and treatment of the sick, communicable diseases, emergencies and first-aid; maternity and infant care; feeding the infant or child; and food needs of the adult.

**Scope of Work**  
A course as obviously helpful to women in all classes, everywhere that it is, is not surprising to learn that the hundreds of groups already instructed have been drawn from many strata of life, including private homes, in town or country, stores, factories, settlements, institutions, unfortunate or crippled girls' offices, clubs, lists for newly arrived girls, colleges, Home and School or Professional and Business Women's Association, the Y.W.C.A., the Canadian girls' training and day nurseries. In order to provide this service to all the necessary organizations, the Red Cross for the past five years has provincial organizers at work in most of the nine provinces, except women who, through devoted and highly efficient efforts have performed great tasks. Just such achievement, in time, toll and sacrifice may be gathered from the individual reports of organizers, both west and east.

**In Eastern Provinces**

Down in New Brunswick, in a recent year, Miss Sibella Barrington organized no less than 77 home nursing groups with a total of 1,340 women

who completed the course. In the accomplishment, Miss Barrington travelled 5,500 miles, 1,100 of which lay over country roads and on these journeys she addressed 99 audiences. As a result of this energetic campaign Home Nursing instruction under Red Cross workers reached in that year every county in New Brunswick. Further extension of the work waits only on the requisite funds and the necessary expert volunteer workers.

**Hardships in West**

In the prairie provinces, where distances are great and climatic conditions often severe, the adventures of Home Nursing organizers are such as bring out the same heroic qualities displayed by the nurses in the Outpost Hospitals as may be gathered from the report of Miss Taylor of Alberta. "The work is hard," she says, "but I have never come up to anything like it in my life." And then comes that last year in the month of April she had visited a region so desolate, "that the most terrible weather, for part of the time, with dust, snow and wind, was taking turns, and with blizzards almost impossible for man, horse or motor." We have been stuck several times in the snow, have been lost on the roads fit to walk on, and our horses promptly, and although accustomed to our bony hard walk, even more helpful in getting up too much snow. We have learned that those who did not return to us, or some other people, and we knew from our friends that any bad infection will never be overcome. I think I was able to save many families from being scattered, waiting for our instruction."
