

Strawberry Hint

As soon as the strawberry plants begin to grow in the spring most of the mulch should be removed from over the plants in order to admit the necessary light and air in the leaves. Remember to leave a light covering of straw, however, to protect the berries and keep them clean, working the remainder of the mulch down between the rows, where it may form a moisture-retaining mulch and prevent weed growth to a considerable extent.
