## Unemployment Is Lessened in Great Britain

Baldwin's Policy is Credited With Improvement—Liberal Leader Attacked

London.—Unemployment in Great Britain had decreased by another 86,000 during the past week, thereby wiping out the last of the recent winter's rise total, which is now down to 1,200,000. This announcement in the House of Commons by the Minister of Labor, Sir Arthur Steel-MacLellan, on Monday night was loudly cheered by the Conservatives, as it meant the Government is now able to claim that Stanley Baldwin's industrial policy, which has been successfully attacked in the recent by-elections by the Liberals and Labor, may after all justify itself.

"It is often said," Sir Arthur justified "that unemployment is greater now than when we took office. This is now untrue. It is actually 36,000 less than when we took office, and in addition 550,000 more people have entered into the various occupations."

The debate was one in which Labor indicted the Government for its failure "to take active measures for stimulating industry by well-considered schemes of national improvement and development." The object of this motion was to show that Labor was not any more backward than the Liberals in proposing schemes for restoring industrial prosperity.

It was thus an occasion not only for the usual interchanges between Labor and the Conservatives, but also for a concentrated attack from both of these parties on Mr. Lloyd George, whose recent dramatic claim that he could reduce unemployment to normal in one year without cost to the taxpayers so eight popular imagination as to have sent up the Liberals' general election prospects by 10 points as measured by the London Stock Exchange quotations. Mr. Lloyd George, though given notice of the attack, nevertheless failed to attend the debate, preferring to be understood to give his answer when he addressed a mass meeting at Albert Hall.

**County Health Units**

The following editorial, taken from the current issue of the Canadian Public Health Journal, supports the contention of responsible health officials all over Canada, that the present system of safeguarding health in rural and semi-rural communities is obsolete.

**ONTARIO, WHAT?**  
There is no doubt that the county health units will provide the solution of the most pressing health needs of Canada. In the larger urban areas the benefits of a well-financed, fully organized full-time health service have been obvious for many years. On the contrary, the high sickness and mortality rates in areas not so cared for have been a manifest demonstration of the need of trained full-time service. One could, without much difficulty, select various areas in Canada in which the health service is of a striking character and efficient. In spite of some exceptions, generally the areas where part-time service is relied upon are characterized by neglect of many of the fundamentals which have come to be looked upon as essential to a successful health service. In the past, a program of health work is found in the places (with a few exceptions) in which a full-time, trained personnel has been made possible.

In various parts of Canada, notably Ontario, the county health unit has been to be eminently satisfactory. In many sections of the country such units would be established were it not for the fact that organization of the county health unit type will definitely save life, a determined effort should be made to make such organization possible for the whole of Canada. The relative poverty of any section of the country should be no reason why that section should be neglected. After all we are all Canadians, whatever province we live in, and surely the part of the Dominion Government is to see that in every part of Canada the most valuable of all assets—human life—is cared for.

The Dominion subsidy of the provinces on condition that the provinces and municipalities do their part, is the only solution of the problem. The Canadian Public Health Association has no hesitation in urging every member of Parliament to give vigorous support to such a project in the full belief that the Dominion-wide scheme should result in a more efficient and efficient in the lives and health of citizens saved for Canada.
