New Alphabet In Turkey Confusing

Adoption of Latin Characters Causes Worry to Natives

PHONETIC SPELLING

Names of Many Well-Known Cities Are Altered

Constantinople.—As a result of Turkey's adoption of the Latin alphabet, the ability of the average Turk has fallen to a rating somewhere in the neighborhood of minus-zero in a spelling test.

lists of trade school classifications. When the Government ordered all shop and trade signs to be changed to new Latin letters, the official spelling dictionary had not been issued. The only principle on which the people could go up to phonetics, and the result was that many signs began Turkish versions of English words, written in ways that would bring tears to the eyes if they also ran in a spelling test.

Phonetic Spelling.

Over the desk of a physician will appear a "sin" bearing the word "Doktor," or "Doctor." Apartment was spelled vaguely, "Apartment" or "Apantman," while ship appeared as "Kubra" or "Gulma."

But however soon it will be changed.

The official dictionary has been issued, and Government officers are marching through all life streets in towns throughout the nation tearing down misspelled signs and instructing owners in the correct spelling.

Meanwhile, the language commissioners fixed the spelling of the names of the 64 provinces of the republic. The chief changes are that Istanbul, the Turkish name for Constantinople, must be written Istanbul; Angora becomes Ankara; Brusa becomes Bursa; Trebizond turns into Trabzon; Afala into Antalla, and Smyrna into Izmir.

Foreign names will be left in their foreign spelling except when they contain letters not in the new Turkish alphabet.

That the work of the dog-poisoners does not always stop with the dog has been proved by a recent case in Toronto, where a young girl was made seriously ill by drinking water from a pail from which a poisoned dog had drunk. The dog, a valuable purebred, had picked up the poison outdoors, probably some that had been placed purposely. Then he went home and, becoming ill, drank from the water-pail in the kitchen. He was found dead in the house. The children came home, and one child took a drink from the pail and became very ill.

Dog-poisoners usually belong to the class of people mentioned in the old ditty:

I hate to see a happy child, it makes me feel so gloomy!"

The dog-haters hate to see a happy dog; it makes them think of strichnia, bi-chloride of mercury, etc. Whatever their opinion may be, they should keep it from taking form in action, for poison often reaches much farther than intended. Like evil thoughts, it carries far afield, and does not stop at the boundaries laid down for it. A bit of poisoned meat might be picked up by a small hungry child, in which case it would go hard with the poison if discovered. Even a dog-poisoner would hesitate to murder a child—although we should hate to think him too far—and to find that his destructive deed had gone beyond its mark, and brought grief to a household far beyond the loss of a dog, would be something to be remembered, even if he were never found out.—Human Pleader.
