Australian Trade

Vancouver, B.C. (Can. Press). There is no doubt Canadian consumers would buy Australian goods if the goods were brought to their attention. This involves salesmanship—aggressively salesmanship. It involves advertising, not spasmodically but systematically. It involves an attempt to meet American competition on its own ground by providing goods of a type to which Canadians are accustomed and in a form which will be attractive to them. All this is a task for the Australian producer and distributor—big for the Canadian consumer. Australia must remember, in holding for the Canadian market, that this market is not a vacuum. It is filled already, and if Australian products are to come in, they must push something else out. And they must make their way largely at the expense of the goods already on the shelves. They will have to compete on their quality, on their cheapness and to quite an appreciable extent on their attractiveness—that they must really depend.

Steel Tires For High Speed

Rubber Tires Have Reached Their Limit of Endurance

Steel automobile tires may be the next major development in super-speed racing, believes Capt. J. S. Hyman, British automobile expert who designed Major H. O. D. Segrave's Golden Arrow.
 Captain Irving is of the opinion that the present-day rubber and fabric racing tire has about reached its limit, as far as withstanding terrific forces is concerned. If the speed record goes much higher, he says, steel tires may have to be put into use.
 The tires on Major Segrave's car, built at a cost of about \$2,500 each, were designed to withstand a speed of 240 to 260 miles an hour for one minute. Major Segrave set the new world record at 231 miles an hour.

Hazard in Tree
 "One of the great hazards of high-speed racing," Captain Irving says, "is in the trees. I have been considering using steel tire for some time, but I am not ready yet to let a man risk his life with speed tires which are not yet in a safe condition."
 The British motor expert believes there is no calculable limit to the speed at which a man can travel in an automobile as long as he is protected from the wind by an enclosure and moves in a straight line.

If the tire ever is reached, he believes it will be at a speed of 350 miles an hour for two-wheel drive cars and 400 miles an hour for cars with four-wheel drive.

"Two Hobgoblins"

Mr. Anson J. Houghton, the retiring U.S. Ambassador, in a striking address at a dinner in London given in his honour, said:
 "If anyone is anxious about the Anglo-American relations because there are unsolved problems between the two peoples I have no words to comfort him. There will never be a time when such a thing does not exist. I confess frankly I see only one reason for distrust. And that is the existence of two mental hobgoblins. One of these hobgoblins appears from time to time in America to assure us that Britain is a predatory Power, cynical, restless of right and wrong, indifferent to the interests of others, greedy, cunning and waiting only for a favorable opportunity to strike us down."
 "The other appears from time to time in America to assure you that as America becomes more conscious of her strength she will inevitably become imperialistic and ruthlessly and brutally seeking to exploit others, will use that strength merely to play the bully and become a danger and a menace to the peoples of the world. If these two hobgoblins speak the truth the future is dark indeed."
 "But these two hobgoblins do not speak the truth. There are no such peoples as those described. The real peoples are wholly different. They are made up of millions of kindly, decent, hard-working, God-fearing men and women, who are busy about their own affairs, who do not fear one another, who want to live in peace, and who mean, God willing, to do so."
 "It is not about time that we recognized that fact fully and consciously and turned definitely away from such fantastic views of our true relations to each other? A durable and unbreakable peace exists even now between the British and American peoples if they will but recognize the fact."

Chileans to Build Children's Theatre to Avoid Bad Plays

Santiago Seeks to Insure Wholesome Entertainment for Young People

AHEAD OF CANADA

Santiago, Chile.—Providing wholesome entertainment for children is a major object in the establishment of a Children's Theatre which is to be constructed here. The building will be used for education and entertainment of children only. The Mayor of Santiago has signed a decree providing for the theatre.
 The Mayor's decree points out that, notwithstanding the modern censorship established here, parents cannot be sure that their children always will see the type of plays and "movies" designed to improve morals and character. The average modern play, in the opinion of the Mayor, not only lacks in good taste and educational art, but in the majority of cases depicts robberies, disorders and the baser passions.

The Mayor believes it is the duty of society in general not only to guard children against all unwholesome impressions, but to endeavor to procure complete development of their mentality through the multiple activities of modern life. In order to put this theory into practice the Children's Theatre will exhibit plays especially prepared for children.

The offerings will be derived from the works of the most proper Chilean authors, based on dignified and patriotic motives, historic episodes and narratives tending to develop a love in the child for wholesome things.

In order that needy as well as wealthy children may attend the theatre and enjoy its benefits, the municipality will furnish an occasional free show.

The British Press

Herbert Tracy in the Labor Magazine (London): The independent newspaper has practically disappeared. The process of concentration has led to the formation of three dominant groups (the Berry, Rothermere and Inveresk combines). Under such conditions it is ridiculous to talk about the freedom of the press. That freedom has been undermined by commercial influences, which in their turn have made untenable the position of independent newspapers. As things now stand, the only apparent alternative is the extension of wireless broadcasting, on the largest possible scale and with the least possible interference. That broadcasting monopoly may conceivably be, in some conspiracy of silence on the part of the press, the only means of guiding and informing public opinion in a period of national crisis.
