**Miss Smith Speaks to Barrhead Women's Institute**

On May 17th the ladies of the Institute and those interested in neighborhood met at the home of Mrs. R. W. Wilson to hear Miss Smith, who was sent out by the Department. After opening the meeting in the usual manner the president briefly reviewed their year's work. Miss Smith then addressed the meeting. She briefly discussed the organizing of Institutes. Thirty years ago Mrs. Hoodless organized the first branch at Stoney Creek. From this it spread throughout Ontario and Canada. At the time of war organizers were sent to Great Britain, then to Europe and Australia, until now it is a world wide organization. Women are benefited morally, intellectually and socially by it. The government recognizes the work they are doing by sending aid to them in grants, free lectures and free literature. She then showed the necessity for people to know what to do in cases of emergencies, especially with children in cases of poisoning, swallowing pins, etc. "Swat the fly and screen the food" was her motto. She showed how disease was spread by the fly and in what ways it could be prevented. Her next topic was Diet, where she brought out the fact that this largely depended on our work. She brought out the idea that more cereals should be used for breakfast and less meat and potatoes; dinner should be more substantial, food and supper a light meal in order to allow the stomach to rest. More vegetables should be used by all. Her address was much enjoyed by all and a hearty vote of thanks was extended to her. Recitations were given by Mrs. McNicol and Mrs. More; a solo by Mrs. Davidson, "You better Bide a Wee," and a duet by Mrs. Wilson and Mrs. Foster, "The Old Rugged Cross." After the ladies part of the meeting the men were invited to join the circle and music was supplied by Messrs. Byron Hill and Clarence Alcox and Miss Ada Hill. Mr. Gordon Beaton favoured the audience with a solo. A dainty lunch was served by the Institute, after which all departed to their respective homes.


