Passing of Joseph Clark Early Pioneer

(The Radville, Sask., Star)
The solemn hour of death was laid Saturday night upon Joseph Clark, an old-time resident of Radville district, after an illness of about two weeks. In the spring of this year Mr. Clark had been very seriously ill and it was feared at that time that he might not recover, but he rallied and was getting a round nicely. In June he visited with his son and two daughters at Weyburn and returned home feeling that he was gradually improving in health. On the night of July 15th during a severe thunder storm Mr. Clark was awakened and called to other members of the family, when it was found that he had suffered a paralytic stroke and one limb was paralyzed below the knee. Following this, gangrene set in a week later and was the immediate cause of death, which came at 11:30 Saturday night. His age was 61 years, 3 months, 3 days.

The late Joseph Clark was born at Dundalk, Ont., and on December 23, 1867, was married to Miss Margaret Brown. They came to Weyburn 25 years ago and after living in that district for a time went on a farm east of Brookings. After a few years there they moved to the present farm home about six miles west of Radville where they have lived for the past 18 years.
