### Henry's Tannery Burned

The tannery belonging to Messrs. J. C. Henry and Son in Markdale was completely destroyed by fire with all contents early on Sunday morning last. The fire was first discovered about one o'clock when some of the patrons of the local restaurant noticed smoke coming from the west end of the village. They secured a car and drove out Main street to investigate and found the building in flames. How the fire started is a mystery as there had been no fire in the building for several days. The alarm brought the brigade out promptly but the fire had gained too great headway to permit of anything being saved. The loss to Messrs. Henry and Son will be close to \$20,000.00 and there is no insurance. They had worked up a splendid trade in leathers and were manufacturing harness for the wholesale trade and the business was constantly growing. The equipment included many costly machines and quite a large stock of finished products were on hand.  
The building was of recent construction erected in 1904 to replace the one destroyed by fire early on the morning of March 10th in that year. Whether the firm will rebuild has not yet been decided, but it is hoped that they will. It is a severe setback to the village and to the firm is a calamity.

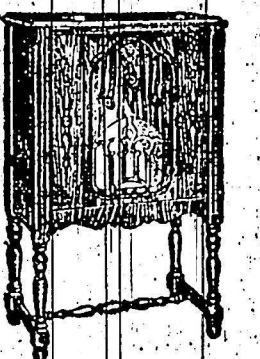

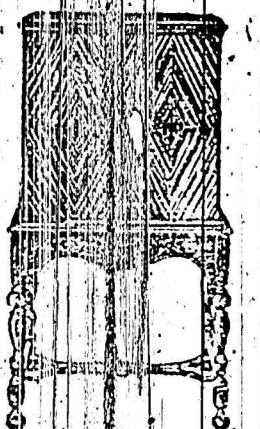
